1 So we are now on the record. 2 Today is September 6, 2024, and this is a transcribed interview of 3 House Resolution 1367 directed this Task 4 Force to investigate the facts and circumstances of 5 the attempted assassination of Donald J. Trump on 6 7 July 13, 2024 in Butler, Pennsylvania. Pursuant to House Resolution 1367, 8 Chairman Kelly and Ranking Member Crow have 9 10 requested this interview as part of the Task Force 11 investigation. 12 BY 13 Can the witness please state their name and spell their last name for the record. 14 15 Α. 16 0. Thank you, My name is , and I'm a senior 17 counsel with the Task Force Majority Staff. 18 I want 19 to thank you for coming in today for this 20 interview. The Task Force recognizes and 21 appreciates that you are here voluntarily. 22 You're allowed to have an attorney 23 present to advise you during this interview. 24 you have an attorney representing you in a personal

capacity present with you today?

Staff Director for the Minority. 1 Thank you all. 2 3 ΒY 4 0. , before we begin, I'd like to go over the ground rules for this interview. 5 The way this interview will proceed is 6 7 as follows: The Majority and Minority staff will 8 alternate asking you questions, 30 minutes per side 9 per round, until each side is finished with their 10 11 questioning. 12 The Majority staff will begin and 13 proceed for 30 minutes, and then the Minority staff 14 will have 30 minutes to ask questions. We will then alternate back and forth in this manner until 15 16 both sides have no more questions. If either side is in the middle of a 17 specific line of questions, they may choose to end 18 19 a few minutes past an hour to ensure completion of 20 that specific line of questioning, including any 21 pertinent followups. 22 In this interview, while one member of 23 the staff for each side may lead the questioning, 24 additional staff may ask questions. 25 There's a court reporter taking

everything down that I say and everything that you say to make a written record of the interview.

For the record to be clear, please wait until the staffer questioning you finishes each question before you begin your answer, and the staffer will wait until you finish your response before proceeding to the next question.

Further, to ensure the court reporter can properly record this interview, please speak clearly, concisely and slowly.

Also, the court reporter cannot record nonverbal answers, such as nodding or shaking your head. So it is important that you answer each question with an audible, verbal answer.

Q. We want you to answer our questions in the most complete and truthful manner possible, so we will take our time.

If you have any questions or do not fully understand the question, please let us know and we will attempt to clarify, add context to, or rephrase our questions.

Q. Although you are here voluntarily and we will not swear you in, you are required, pursuant to 18 U.S. Code § 1001, to answer questions from Congress truthfully. This also applies to questions posed by congressional staff in an interview.

- Q. Finally, I'd like to note that the content of what we discuss here today is confidential. We ask that you not speak about what we discuss here today in this interview to any outside individual in order to preserve the integrity of this investigation.

For those same reasons, the marked exhibits used today will be provided to the court

reporter so that they may go in the official 1 2 transcript, and any copies of those exhibits will be returned to us when we wrap up. 3 We plan to take a five-minute break at 4 the end of each 30 minutes of questioning, but if 5 you need a longer break or a break before that, 6 7 please let us know and we're happy to accommodate. However, to the extent that there's a 8 pending question, we would ask that you finish 9 10 answering the question before we take the break. 11 Do you understand? 12 Α. Yes. 13 Do you have any other questions for us before we begin? 14 15 Α. No. 16 It is now 4:26, and the Majority staff will Ο. 17 begin questions. , thank you for being here 18 19 As an initial matter, can you please 20 describe to us your job description? 21 My job description would be patrolman for Α. 22 Butler Township Police. I don't know if you want me to go further into that. 23 24 If you could please just --Q.

Answer calls.

1	Q outline your responsibilities and tasks
2	and assignments.
3	A. Answer calls, provide traffic control,
4	whatever. The day in question I would be just
5	answering calls that day.
6	Q. And by answering calls, does that mean, you
7	know, taking the patrol car out to respond?
8	What does that mean?
9	A. Yeah. I also had a patrol car assigned to
10	me, as usually my zone of coverage would have been
11	134 zone. So that was 422, like Walmart area.
12	I know you're not familiar with the
13	zones in Butler, but Meridian, which is where the
14	farm show is. Like Bon Aire would also be in my
15	zone. That was my zone coverage that day.
16	That's every daylight Saturday how the
17	rotation works. I usually end up with that zone.
18	Q. Okay. And just as a general matter, can
19	you just explain your responsibilities on a
20	day-to-day basis a little more for us in terms of
21	what you're responsible for and what you do?
22	A. Answer calls. Investigate crashes.
23	Investigate crimes. Conduct traffic stops. Normal
24	patrol work.
25	Q. Thank you. And how long have you worked

1	for the Butler Township Police Department?
2	A. It will be 15 years in October.
3	Q. For the July 13th event, the campaign rally
4	at the Butler farm show, can you describe when you
5	became first aware of that event taking place on
6	July 13th?
7	A. The week prior. I don't have the day for
8	you.
9	Q. How did you become aware of it?
10	Did someone tell you that it was
11	happening? Did you receive an e-mail?
12	A. Through social media, and we talked about
13	it at the station. Kind of simultaneously.
14	Q. When did you learn that you would be
15	working at the July 13th event?
16	A. I was working that day.
17	Q. And how did you learn it? Like through
18	your boss?
19	Did anyone tell you that you would be
20	working?
21	A. I was scheduled to work that day.
22	: Point of
23	clarification: is asking were you assigned
24	to this event, and your answer is for that day.
25	My day was patrol that

1 day. 2 Do you understand what he's --3 4 Yes. Just to clarify, I was scheduled to work 5 Α. that day for patrol, and my zone of patrol was the 6 7 farm show. Thank you for talking through that with us. 8 Ο. 9 Did you receive any documents or any 10 specific instructions for that day that were 11 specific to the campaign rally? 12 Any type of operational plan or aerial 13 diagrams or maps? 14 So there was an operational plan, and I was not -- I believe I'm in it. You asked the guy 15 16 working the road, and I was in it there. 17 I sat through the briefing just so I 18 would know what was going on, but I was not part of 19 the event. 20 But there's 25,000 people, or however 21 many it was there, in a small area, and most likely, all my calls would be from the event. 22 23 So I sat through the event -- or I sat 24 through the briefing. 25 And when did that briefing take place? Q.

1	A. It was either 09 or 10. I'm not exactly
2	sure.
3	Q. And that was at the station?
4	A. Yeah, it was at the station.
5	Q. I'm going to introduce a document for the
6	record here. This will be Majority Exhibit 1.
7	(Majority Exhibit No. 1 was marked for
8	identification.)
9	BY MR. KELLY:
10	Q. When you say your briefing took is that
11	the morning of July 13th?
12	A. Yes.
13	Q. That's the only time you sat in on any type
14	of briefing or anything?
15	A. For this event, yes.
16	Q. For that event, yes. Specifically that
17	event on that day.
18	A. But I also was aware that I was working the
19	road. So I knew I was not going to be part of this
20	plan.
21	Q. Okay. All right. That's fine.
22	BY BY
23	Q. Do you recognize this document?
24	A. I believe so.
25	Q. So this document is labeled the Butler

Township Operational Plan. The mission of this 1 2 operational plan is to provide traffic control at various intersections in and around Butler Farm 3 4 Show grounds. 5 On the Assignments page on Page 2, there's a number of intersections listed, and some 6 7 of the intersections have Butler Township personnel tasked at those specific intersections. 8 9 Do you recognize your name on this 10 Assignments sheet? 11 Α. No. 12 0. There's a patrol unit identified at the 13 Greenwood Drive intersection at SR 0422. 14 But that's not specific to me either. Α. 15 That's not specific to you? Q. 16 There's two patrol officers on that day. Α. 17 Okay. And you were in the other patrol Ο. unit? 18 19 I was in one patrol unit. The other patrol 20 unit was going to be the zone like south of us. 21 that would have been like Lyndora, South Butler, 22 that kind of stuff. 23 So had I been tied up, could have 24 come up and handled that. I'm assuming that's

where he meant when he says patrol unit.

I'm on the last pages of this packet. 1 Ο. 2 There's an Intersections of Responsibility that list some intersections. I think it's a few pages 3 4 prior to there. 5 On this map, can you describe where your 6 patrol zone was located? If you want to use my 7 copy, here. It would start up here at 422. 8 We cover 422 and the whole way down to below Buttercup. 9 10 pretty much here (indicating). 11 I'm not exactly sure on the map where, 12 if I can draw a line. Do you know what I mean? 13 Uh-huh. Ο. 14 The line from Butler Township would be over 15 here (indicating) somewhere, and everything east of 16 t.hat.. 17 Ο. Okay. Does that make sense? 18 19 So your patrol was more of a roving duty on 0. 20 July 13th? 21 Yes. Α. 22 So you could be at various places all 23 around the Butler Farm Show grounds? 24 And all Butler Farm Show is not Α. Yes. 25 actually in Butler Township.

Q. That's right.

- A. So it was, like I said, everything east of that, and a lot of the farm show is not. But just because I needed to get around, I was over that way. I usually don't end up over that way.
- Q. Okay. At the July 13th event, can you describe getting to the AGR building and how you came to arrive at the AGR building that day?
 - A. Specific to when?
- Q. At any point you were in or about the area of the AGR building.
 - A. You mean for the active shooter or just --
- Q. Just in your patrol, were you around the AGR building? Were you driving past it? Were you walking by it?
- A. I was driving up and down Whitestown Road.

 I don't know how many times I would have drove by

 it. I drove by Meridian.

Like I said, I was getting calls and I was patrolling that area. So I would have been driving by it countless times.

- Q. Countless times?
- A. I have no idea.
- Q. So countless times driving by the AGR building around that area?

1 Α. Probably more on Meridian Road, but, yeah. On Meridian Road. 2 Q. During that time, are you driving by the 3 4 AGR building, or just in and around the Butler Farm 5 Show grounds, did you hear any reports of a suspicious individual? 6 7 So are you talking about the specific event Α. of the shooter? How I got my information was I 8 went and checked on -- as you know, we had 9 10 different guys at the intersection, and I just 11 checked in on them to see how they're doing. Talk 12 for a minute. 13 I checked on _____, Patrolman I was talking to him when he received information 14 15 of the guy with the range finder, and then Secret 16 Service was standing there with us, and 17 ended up messaging me a picture of them. 18 Okay. So you were physically with 19 checking in on him? 20 Α. Yes. I was just literally checking on him. 21 "Hey, do you got water, whatever," yeah. 22 Q. Driving past station? 23 Α. Yes. 24 Where his post was stationed? Q. 25 He was there with a Secret Service member.

Α.

1 Ο. With who? I'm sorry. 2 It was him and a Secret Service member at Brady Paul Lane. 3 Brady Paul Lane, okay. 4 Ο. Do you recall around what time that was? 5 It might be on -- we did a timeline. 6 Α. 7 might be on the timeline turned in. 8 And what was your conversation with 9 during that time? 10 What did he say about the suspicious 11 person? 12 Α. He had a range finder. He had a range finder. 13 Ο. 14 The sniper spotted him with a range finder. Α. Do you do anything with that information 15 Q. via your radio? 16 17 I was on County 2. I was not on OPS 3. was not on OPS 4. I was scanning them, but when 18 19 you're scanning those other frequencies and you're 20 on County 2, anything that comes up on County 2, it 21 overrides county traffic. Like County 2, actually, 22 overrides those. We talked about it. 23 After a short 24 conversation, I went back down Meridian Road. 25 There's a water tower somewhere over there.

1 drove back to the water tower just to see if I 2 could see him. There was a trooper sitting there. 3 4 couldn't see the trooper sitting there from where 5 we were on Brady Paul Lane. 6 Q. And that trooper was state police? 7 It was a state trooper in a marked Α. Yes. We just couldn't see him. I didn't know he 8 9 was there. 10 I said something to the trooper about, 11 "Hey, there's a guy." I gave a description. 12 can't give the description off the top of my head 13 right now. 14 "There was a description of this man. 15 Have you seen him?" He's like no, he didn't see 16 him either. 17 I looked around. I could see -- from the tower to AGR, I could see there was like nobody 18 19 fitting that description. I think there was maybe 20 like one person walking through. 21 Okay. And when you had that conversation Ο. 22 with the state trooper, that was in person. 23 You stopped by where he was located? 24 Yes. Yes. Α.

And was there any other personnel from

Q.

Butler Township at that time there? 1 2 Α. No. So do you keep driving south on Meridian 3 Ο. 4 after talking with the state police trooper? I go back out to Meridian Road, and I again 5 stop and talk to and Secret Service because 6 7 they're still talking about this. 8 And then -- and I'm not sure who it comes from, if it was the Secret Service to 9 10 or just the Secret Service member himself. 11 I remember there was some talk about it. I think I think the Secret Service called 12 all three of us. 13 I have no idea. But the Secret Service said, "If you find him, we'll talk to him." 14 So I then drove south on Meridian Road 15 16 to see if I could find him. 17 Okay. At what point did you know that the threat had been elevated of the suspicious person 18 19 and you might be needed to go back to the building or take another action? 2.0 21 So I went south. I think at Buttercup I Α. 22 made a right, came back out Grist, and then went 23 back on 68, which would have been right by AGR. 24 There was a report of the same individual between 25 AGR and going towards Sheetz.

1 Q. Okay. 2 And then I started from there. Okay. What radio channel did you get that 3 Ο. 4 information? Was that police channel 2? 5 I don't think it was on 2. I'm not 6 Α. 7 watching the radio. I don't have to watch the radio. Do you know what I mean? 8 Like while I'm driving down the road, I 9 don't have to look at the radio to see what 10 11 channel's popping up. 12 I think it was OPS 3, but I don't know 13 for sure, to be honest. 14 So you hear that the suspicious individual 15 is going towards Sheetz. So you cut in and you follow that direction? 16 17 Α. Yes. Can you describe the next steps that you 18 Ο. 19 took? 20 Α. Well, I believe before I got there -- well, 21 we pull in, come around. So one of the snipers 22 comes out. I believe it was from Beaver County because I did not recognize him. 23 I don't know who

he was. I know he was one of the snipers from the

ESU team, but I did not recognize him.

24

He said, "Well, the guy went that" -kind of pointed, and he pointed back towards the
building, and if you've been around the building,
you know how confusing the building is with how the
cuts and -- it's really extremely confusing, and I
did not know that you couldn't go from, like, one
side to the other side the way those warehouses are
kind of stacked in there.

So he said he went that way. So I looked, and as I drove by, I was like, "Where did he go?" Because I wasn't sure, to be honest.

So I started back around the building.

The other side, when I was on the other side of the building, Patrolman , I can hear him saying somebody was on the roof.

After he said somebody was on the roof, I turned around and started back towards where his location was, assuming that I could see him from there, where Patrolman was, because he was coming up that way.

And then I believe when he radioed that, somebody else radioed that we didn't have any assets on the roof. Again, I don't know who that was that said that, but that makes sense. It didn't make sense. Put it that way.

Do you know at that time what radio 1 Ο. 2 transmission that came in on? Was that police officer Channel 2? 3 4 that OPS 3? 5 Α. Probably OPS 3. Again, I'm on 2 but 6 scanning 3. 7 Yeah. Ο. 8 My main purpose is to answer calls on 2. 9 0. Yes. 10 Obviously, this comes in and overrides Α. 11 that, but my main purpose there is to answer calls on 2. 12 13 Just to back up a step, around the time Ο. 14 that you hear that there's a suspicious individual 15 that's cutting towards Sheetz and you cut in, you 16 meet a ESU sniper. 17 You don't know what sniper they're affiliated with, what group they're affiliated 18 19 with, but is that interaction like in person? 2.0 Are you in your patrol car at that 21 point? 22 I'm in my patrol car. He comes out and 23 yells to us and said, "He went this way." 24 So it was in person. I'm in a patrol 25 I didn't get out. car.

Okay. And then you encounter Officer 1 Q. 2 Are you also in the patrol car then? I don't encounter . I hear him on the 3 4 radio. 5 Q. Hear him on the radio, okay. So after speaking with the ESU sniper 6 7 from your car, you keep driving. Where do you go? 8 Around the other side of the building. 9 10 Okay. And that's towards the AGR parking Ο. 11 lot; correct? 12 Α. Towards -- no. He was in the parking lot. 13 There's different parking lots for the AGR building, but the main parking lot -- I'm assuming 14 what you're referring to -- is where I would have 15 16 seen the sniper and he pointed back towards, like, the building as he, like, went between the building 17 or something. That's when I went back around the 18 19 front of the building. 2.0 Had you seen the suspicious individual at Q. any point with your own eyes? 21 22 Α. Mr. Crooks? 23 Ο. Yes. 24 Earlier that day I did see him, and the Α. 25 only reason I know that is because he has such a

1 recognizable face. But I do not remember where I 2 seen him at. Do you remember around what time you might 3 4 have seen him? 5 I remember seeing a picture of him, like I seen here today, just because his face is that 6 7 recognizable. 8 Q. And you said you saw a picture of him? 9 Α. Yes. 10 And that was on your phone? Ο. 11 Α. Yes. 12 Q. Do you remember who sent that picture? 13 Α. sent that to me. 14 : I'm sorry. Who sent it? 15 So you've heard -- you had spoken with the 16 Ο. 17 ESU sniper. You've heard Officer over the 18 radio. 19 Can you describe your next actions? 20 Α. He described the guy on the roof. I came 21 back around to the parking lot where I originally 22 seen the sniper, and everybody came pulling in, 23 starting to kind of surround the building. 24 Patrolman said, you know, "We're 25 gonna have to get on the roof." So however --

was, I have no idea. Me and him get 1 where I don't even know how they got there. 2 together. But me and him get together, and I say 3 4 something to like, "Hey, I'll push you up; you pull me up. " And I push him onto -- like lift 5 him onto the roof. 6 7 He puts his foot between my two hands and I lift him up the best I can because there are 8 no ladders. We didn't see any other way up. And 9 10 that was the shortest point that we could find. 11 I'm not saying that there weren't other 12 ones, but that's the best we could do at the time. So you're actively looking for places where 13 you could possibly get on the roof? 14 That's the best we could come up with 15 Yes. Α. in a hastily fashion of trying to get up there. 16 17 I try to get him up to the roof. He's kind of on the side, however he is up there. 18 19 He comes back down screaming, "THERE'S AN AR! A GUY WITH AN AR!" 20 AN AR! 21 He comes down, kind of, onto me and 22 rolls his ankle, and we back up, drop down, 23 obviously. And then within a few seconds after 24 25 that, we actually -- well, back up. I know the

trooper called it out. I believe called it out, too: THERE'S AN AR, A GUY WITH AN AR OR A LONG GUN ON THE ROOF!"

The trooper is in his car, and I could see him. He said, "Did you guys call it out?" And he called it out again on his frequency. I have no idea what frequency he was on. So I have no idea.

But I know he called it out, and then that's when we got back up. We draw weapons, and a few seconds after that we hear shooting, both going out and then coming in.

- Q. Okay. After you heard shots, what was your reaction?
 - A. The shots?
 - Q. Yeah.

A. Well, you could hear shots going out, and you heard one come in. Well, I didn't hear the two come in. I only heard the one come in that was loud, and we all kind of -- I knew that was a hit from the way everybody else was saying that you could hear it hit the building or hit him or the building.

Then after he was shot and they said, "Shooter down," I believe we started clearing AGR itself.

Okay. And for what purpose was that? 1 Q. 2 To ensure that nobody else was inside the building. 3 4 Ο. And where did you receive that instruction to clear the building? 5 I do not know. 6 Α. 7 Were you able to successfully clear the AGR Ο. building for any other suspicious individuals or 8 make sure that the building was clear? 9 10 Α. We did. It took quite some time. 11 About how long would you say that it took? 12 Α. It's hard to guess on time, especially in 13 that situation, but we went through, I would say, 14 anywhere between a half hour and an hour. Were you clearing the building with other 15 0. 16 local law enforcement entities? 17 Α. Some people, I had no idea who they were. 18 Ο. Okay. 19 The first stack that went in there, it was 20 guys I had no idea who they were. 21 Did you recognize any Secret Service Ο. 22 officials there helping clear the building? One of them came in, wouldn't really talk 23 24 to anybody, and then would come back, walk out.

have no idea who he was.

Was he there until the completion of 1 Ο. 2 searching the AGR building after the shots? I didn't see that quy again. He had a blue 3 vest on that said Secret Service. Because I asked 4 him if everybody was okay. He just went, "Eh, I 5 don't know." 6 7 What did you think about that? Ο. What did I think about that? I'd just 8 rather hold my opinion to myself. 9 10 What did you do after you cleared the AGR 0. 11 building? 12 Did you stay around the AGR building. 13 Did you resume your patrol? 14 After I cleared the AGR building, I went back out to the fence line. There was some more 15 16 communication. 17 Like I carried a box of gloves over and threw them onto the roof for the guys, and then 18 19 after that, I went out and stood on the perimeter 20 for however many hours it was. 21 When did you ultimately end up leaving the 0. 22 Butler Farm Show grounds and leave your work for 23 that day? 24 At some point we went to the CP to give

a -- it was what? 11:30 at night, somewhere in

I don't have my timeline in front of me. 1 there. 2 I gave a quick statement to PSP Butler -- or not Butler -- just the Pennsylvania 3 4 State Police -- which was recorded that night, and I was relieved from there. 5 I had to go back and get my car to go 6 7 back to the AGR and still parked where I originally 8 was parked, got my car and then left. 9 When you went to the CP, do you mean the 10 command post? 11 Α. Yes. 12 0. And where was that command post? Was it the local trailer that had local 13 14 law enforcement entities or was ---I was not in it. So I can't tell you who 15 Α. was in command of that post. I just know we were 16 17 to go up to the CP. There were a lot of guys walking around. I didn't know who they all were. 18 19 There were some individuals when we first came in on the left that had Secret Service 20 21 They were sitting in chairs. on them. 22 There were a lot of people in the 23 building. I recognized some of them as PSP. 24 didn't recognize a lot of other people. So I can't

tell you who was who, other than I can tell you

Secret Service were wearing vests that said Secret 1 2 Service, and I could see there were some troopers I recognized. 3 4 Other than that, I have no idea who a 5 lot of those people were. So this a really a building that you 6 Ο. 7 were reporting to at the end of the day. And was that maybe towards, you know, 8 the front of the Butler Farm Show grounds? 9 10 It was towards the front, and I never went 11 inside. I gave my statement outside. 12 Q. Okay. And you gave that statement to 13 Pennsylvania State Police? 14 Yes. And I cannot remember their names. 15 After giving that statement, before coming Q. 16 to talk to us, had you prepared any type of After-17 Action Report or other similar type oral or written statement about the events of July 13th? 18 19 I gave a statement to Pennsylvania State 20 Police and the FBI that week following. I don't 21 know what day it was. And was that a separate interaction with 22 23 both entities, or were they together? 24 They were together. Α.

They were together?

1	A. It was I forget his name. He was kind
2	of running the interview. State police would have
3	been kind of running the interview, and then FBI
4	was standing sitting on both sides. They really
5	didn't have much other than a few things here and
6	there.
7	Q. During your patrol during the day of
8	July 13th, did you identify any other suspicious
9	individuals, other than Crooks, during your work?
10	A. No.
11	
12	Q. You mentioned Officer had texted you
13	a picture of what you eventually appreciated to be
14	Mr. Crooks.
15	A. Yeah.
16	Q. Had you received any other texts that day?
17	A. What do you mean? From?
18	Q. Independent of Crooks but just as far as
19	communicating with fellow law enforcement.
20	A. I don't know. Sometimes myself and
21	Sergeant will call each other or text each
22	other if the radio traffic's tied up. It's not
23	uncommon for us to do that.
24	Just be like, "Hey, I got" do you

know what I mean? Just a quick. And I can't

remember. 1 2 Sure. Q. 3 And I was there since 8:00, so I'm guessing I contacted a fellow officer. I presume that I 4 would have contacted a fellow officer. Do you know 5 what I mean? 6 7 I was there since at 8 a.m., and that was what time it occurred. So I'm sure there was 8 some other contact with other officers. 9 10 Ο. What about e-mail? Was that also a way to 11 get in touch with people? 12 Was e-mail also a way to get in touch 13 with folks the same way as text was? 14 Α. No. 15 Q. No? 16 We're at time for our staff. 17 The chairman has a 18 question. 19 BY MR. KELLY: 20 Q. So you were hoisting Officer 21 onto the roof; is that correct? 22 So he would have been right below the roof that the shooter was on? 23 24 Α. Yes. 25 Okay. So when you said earlier you hear Q.

the shots, there were two other shots after that 1 2 were incoming towards the shooter? You detected two shots coming in? 3 I heard the one for sure because it was 4 louder and it sounded different. 5 So I could hear his shots going out. 6 7 know two shots came in. I could identify the one that came in because it was coming in much louder. 8 Which one is that? 9 10 That would have been the 11 last shot. The last shot? 12 Ο. Yeah. 13 Α. 14 So I didn't realize there were two shots Ο. 15 that came in. What I thought --16 I thought there were two shots because of Α. the other sniper shot, too, and then Secret 17 Service, but I heard for sure one shot come in. 18 19 Okay. So when you said that you thought 20 the Secret Service sniper and then the other 21 sniper, who would that have been? 22 One of ours? 23 One of ours, yes. Α. 24 But there's definitely two shots that came Q. 25 in?

From my understanding, yes, two shots came 1 Α. 2 in, but I heard one shot. So you heard one shot, but you assumed 3 4 there were two shots. 5 Why do you assume? 6 Α. I know there's two shots now. 7 Ο. You know it now? I know that now. 8 Α. Based on what? 9 Ο. 10 Based on talking to my colleagues. Α. 11 So somebody else had told you there were Q. 12 actually two shots? 13 Α. Yes. 14 You knew for sure you heard one? Ο. 15 Α. Yes. 16 But you are assuming the second shot that Ο. 17 came in you didn't hear or you weren't able to distinguish it? 18 19 I wasn't able to distinguish it. 20 Q. Okay. 21 I wasn't able to distinguish the one shot 22 that came in. The one shot that I was able to distinguish was a larger caliber and for sure was 23 24 coming in.

being there, I heard the shots that were taken. 1 2 didn't realize there were more shots after that. So it's hard for me to distinguish 3 4 because when it was all happening, I wasn't 5 counting shots. I was trying to cover So it's interesting. 6 7 How many shots do you think Crooks took? I didn't count that day, but afterwards I 8 9 heard eight. 10 Ο. Eight? 11 But I can't testify to that. Α. 12 Ο. I've heard the same thing. But again, any 13 situation like that, who's counting? All I'm 14 hearing is a series of gunshots. 15 Α. Yes. 16 And so I'm trying to understand. Ο. 17 My assumption was that -- my understanding is that there was communication, 18 19 before the sniper on the roof, that he had him in 20 his sight. 21 So he was waiting for the okay to act, 22 and if the idea to engage was after Crooks had 23 fired eight shots, I'm trying to understand --24 I don't -- I can't make any sense for you

on that one. All I know, from being involved here,

Q. We can go back on the record. It is 5:04 p.m. This is ______, Investigative Counsel for the Minority.

Thank you again, sir, both for your service and for indulging us that it is 5 p.m. on a Friday afternoon on your day off. So we will try to get through this as expeditiously as possible.

I just want to cover, not to retread too much on what my colleagues covered, but just to make sure I sort of understand the flow of the day.

As I understand it, Saturday afternoon or Saturday morning you were scheduled to be on patrol. There was nothing -- you were not assigned to this, nor did you sort of sign up for overtime to be on a detail to cover the rally?

A. Right.

Q. Okay, great.

So you were on patrol that day, and how you become aware that there even was a briefing?

I think you mentioned that morning to discuss the rally and this operation plan that my colleagues discussed.

- A. There's not many of us that work there.
- Q. You showed up at work?
- A. Somebody said, "We're briefing."

1 Q. And saw that they were gathering? 2 Α. Yeah. And what was covered in that briefing, that 3 Ο. 4 you recall? 5 Α. The Township Operation Plan. Any understanding, during that briefing, of 6 0. 7 other law enforcement agencies that would be covering the rally and who might be sort of the 8 head or lead agency in charge and how Butler 9 10 Township police fit into that picture? 11 Α. To be honest, I don't recall everything that was said. 12 So walking away from that, what was your 13 understanding of your role for the day? 14 Cover calls. 15 Α. 16 Cover calls, driving. Okay. Ο. And I think we said that the farm 17 grounds is not entirely in Butler Township. So not 18 19 entirely in your zone. 2.0 What about the AGR building 21 specifically? Is that in Butler Township? 22 I believe that's Butler Township. I don't 23 know if all the AGR property is. Fair enough. Because it's sort of a 24 25 sprawling set of billings, as we were discussing?

Yeah. And I'm not sure where that line 1 Α. 2 goes. Were you familiar with it prior to 3 Ο. 4 July 13th from it being in your --Of that line? 5 Α. Or just of that building? Had you ever 6 7 patrolled around there before? I've had, I think, a lot of calls there, 8 but it had been a long time. 9 10 Okay. Knowing that that building was sort Ο. 11 of close to the rally site, did you have any 12 reaction about this is something we should cover? 13 Maybe I should or somebody should be in that area 14 to cover it? We there told there were assets in the 15 Α. 16 building. So I kind of couldn't think about much other than that. 17 And who told you that? 18 Ο. 19 I don't recall. 20 Q. And when you say "assets in the building," 21 what is that? 22 Α. There were snipers in the building. 23 Snipers from...? Do you know what Ο. 24 organization? 25 Α. There were snipers who were going to

be in the building. I don't know when I found out 1 2 it was Butler ESU snipers. I don't even know if I found that out 3 4 during the event or after the event. I just knew 5 there were going to be assets in the building. 6 0. But before the event, you knew there were 7 going to be assets in the building? 8 Α. Right. 9 You were not sure who. Did you ever hear Ο. 10 that there might be assets on the roof of the 11 building? 12 I did not hear that. 13 In hindsight, 20/20 always, would you have 14 had assets on the roof? Does that --15 Is that a question you 16 can even answer? 17 Is that a question you can answer? Ο. No, that's not a question that I can -- I'm 18 19 not involved in the planning. 2.0 Q. Fair enough. Not involved in the planning. 21 I'm asking more is your familiarity limited as of 22 maybe with the building? Was that something that 23 jumped out to you at any point? And it sounds like 24 not; that you thought --25 Α. That is not my --

Understood.

Between that briefing -- I think you said it was around 9 or 10 in the morning. The incident happens just after 6 p.m.

Generally, you're driving up and down, I believe you said, sort of Whitestown -- I think it's Whitestown Road and --

- A. Meridian Road.
- Q. -- Meridian Road.
- A. Answering calls. At one point they called me, and I took somebody from the county, from the Trump, from the site, over to Sheetz to get a bunch of ice, and then I took them back.
- Q. And I think you have a map in front of you that we have not yet marked, but I'll introduce it as Exhibit A.

(Minority Exhibit A was marked for identification.)

Q. This is a map that we have printed and might just help to quickly orient us. So I think that Whitestown Road is sort of towards the top where there's a yellow line there.

So you're sort of patrolling there. You come down what I'll call the side of the map. I'm not sure exactly how it's oriented -- north, south

east -- but it would be, I guess --

- A. You realize I patrol a whole lot bigger area than this; right?
 - O. Yes, I do.

- A. Like miles outside of this, too.
- Q. So on that day, how much of your time is spent sort of in this area versus the miles outside?

Mostly outside, I take it?

- A. Like I said, there were going to be like 25,000 residents there. I suspected all my problems for the day would be right here.
 - Q. Okay.
 - A. So I spent as much as I could here.
- Q. So you did stick close to there, even though appreciating on any other Saturday, you would be much further out?
- A. Yes. But, like I said, because of the amount of people, I knew where my problems would be that day.
 - O. Understood.

So before any problems arise, I believe you said -- and I just want to confirm sort of where we are on the map -- that at some point you saw somebody from Pennsylvania State Police, a

state trooper, and a Secret Service officer. 1 2 About where were they positioned on this 3 map? 4 So the Secret Service would have been at 5 the end of the Brady Paul Lane. 6 Ο. At the end of Brady Paul Lane, you can use 7 that to mark --Right there (indicating). 8 9 Ο. Okay. 10 With Patrolman . And then the Α. 11 trooper would have been --12 0. So that's sort of, just for the record, 13 since the record can't see it, that's Brady Paul 14 Lane at the intersection of where there's a yellow 15 line basically or Brady Paul and Meridian Road? 16 That intersection is where you saw? 17 Brady Paul Lane. Α. Yes. But at the intersection with Meridian is 18 Ο. 19 what I was just trying to understand. And remind me. What was that 2.0 21 interaction with the state trooper and Secret 22 Service? What did you discuss? 23 Just --24 So, I mean, it was a different interaction Α. 25 with Secret Service than it was with state police.

1 Q. Okay. 2 Which one are you referring to? 3 That's helpful. I was conflating the two. Ο. 4 Maybe you can just again, very briefly -- you're patrolling. Who else do you see 5 in the course of the day? 6 7 When do you see the trooper? When do you see the Secret Service officer? 8 and the Secret Service is 9 So I saw Α. 10 with at Brady Paul Lane. 11 Q. Secret Service is with ? I see him first. 12 Α. 13 Got it. And I take it -- do you recall the Ο. 14 Secret Service officer's name or anything? Tall, thin guy. 15 No. Α. 16 Around what time was that? Ο. Tall, thin guy. 17 Α. Tall, thin guy. Around what time --18 Q. 19 I suppose that describes most of them. 20 realize that. But tall, thin guy. 21 Fair enough. Q. 22 Α. Younger guy. And were they stationed together? Did they 23 Ο. 24 just happen to be around the same --25 Α. I couldn't tell you.

- Q. And what was the substance of that discussion with and the Secret Service agent?
 - A. The picture he sent and then --

- Q. So this is after you had received the text message from ?
- A. Well, sent me -- we talked about it before sent it to me. I don't know when he sent it to me. I just don't know exactly because he was sending it to other people.

But we talked about it there. I went back to the water tower where I made contact with the trooper at the water tower, and I think I said then we did not know there was a trooper stationed there from the way the hills kind of roll down. I couldn't see him from there.

Like where we were standing on Brady

Paul Lane, I don't think we could see the trooper

there because was like, "Do you want to go

check over there at the water tower to see if he's

over there?"

And then when I pulled up to the water tower, I could see there was a trooper there. I kind of figured he wasn't there but still looked around and said something to the trooper.

Okay. Was there anybody else with the 1 Q. 2 trooper there? Was there Secret Service up there? Anybody from Butler? 3 4 Α. No. He was by himself. 5 Ο. Was he in a car? He was in a car by himself pretty much. 6 7 And what discussion, if any, did you have Ο. with him? 8 Just that we were looking for this guy with 9 Α. 10 a range finder. 11 Okay. And at that point all you know is a Q. 12 guy with a range finder. Any other information 13 about the potentially --14 Just a description of a gray shirt, khaki 15 shorts. I can't remember exactly, though. 16 But no indication at that point that this Ο. 17 person was armed or anything else? 18 Α. No. 19 0. Okay. At any point during the day did you 20 see any drones flying? 21 Do you recall that? 22 Α. No. We are told in the briefing -- I do remember this -- that if you see a drone, call him. 23 24 So that was part of the briefing. Anything Q. 25 else?

Now that that just triggered your 1 2 memory, anything else about the briefing about 3 particularly suspicious activity to keep an eye out for? 4 If you see a drone, call it in. 5 Α. That's up to Detective to say that. 1 Α. 2 Well, I'm asking what you --Q. I didn't talk to Detective 3 Α. after 4 that. 5 Q. Okay. So you put him on the roof and that 6 was it? 7 I put him on the roof, and I didn't see him Α. again, other than he called me and was like, "Hey, 8 that's crazy. I gotta meet with you sometime." 9 10 And that was it. 11 Okay. So you never saw him again that day? Q. 12 Α. No. He had, as you know, an ankle injury, 13 and he went from that location -- after the 14 adrenalin wore off, he ended up realizing that he 15 did have an ankle injury and went to the hospital. 16 At any point throughout this, are you Ο. 17 wearing a body-worn camera? 18 Α. times I've been out and gone to whatever it is I've gone to, it's amazing to me that the only person that comes up in the whole day is somebody with long hair, a gray tee shirt, and light khaki pants.

So that person keeps coming up. So I'm thinking of all the thousands of people all over that field, do you know what? There is one person that's really suspicious. I've got to think -- I'm not a law enforcement officer -- but for some reason this is the lead of who it is we're looking for and where we're trying to find him because it seems to me the back and forth, everything that happened after that, is you all trying to get at, "Where is he now? I see him. No, he's not there now. I can't find him. Where did he come in from?" There was a lot of conversation about him on a bicycle.

But that's the only person, of all the thousands of people that traversed that whole area that day, that we think is suspicious.

So there must be something about him that you all just get a sense of, and if we weren't able to batten down the hatches on where he was when we were looking for him and knowing that the former president of the United States was going to

be out there, was there no conversation: "You know what? Hold him up until we actually find out where this suspicious person is."

Because the only person that gets described by any of you -- by the way, I'm not pointing the finger at you -- the only person that comes up out of all those thousands of people that were on that property that day, the only one that comes up consistently is this one. Is this one. Long hair. Glasses. Has this shirt on. Has these pants on.

It's just odd to me that of all of that population that was on that field, there's one person that sticks out to everybody who's in law enforcement.

So who is that getting filtered to at the command center? So I'm trying to understand this. So all these reports, who does it go in to and who then makes the decision of, "Hey, do you know what? Until we locate him, until we actually talk to him and have a conversation, let's keep Trump back in the tent"?

I mean --

A. I don't have the answer for you on that one.

Q. Do you know what? Nobody's able to give it to us.

- A. Do you know what I mean? Where I was --
- Q. I think you guys did a hell of a job. I mean, if somebody threw this to me before we kick off for the Super Bowl -- if I said, "So what's my assignment?" "Well, you guys just kind of hang around. You do what you always do. Everything's going to be all right."

So I'm trying to think, when we say a command post, who's in the command post and who's the pilot on that plane that's going to be able to direct?

And when people tell me, "Well, you don't understand. Because of the different frequencies, we couldn't understand each other."

At some point somebody should have said, "Stop this show right now. If we can't communicate, we can't continue."

And if we see a suspicious person -- and many people see him at different times -- you guys are experts at picking out people, except for that day. You had already picked him out. You quit seeing him, but for some reason, somebody at some point should have said, "Stop the music. We don't

know where he is now. Now we're really starting to wonder."

And I hate to keep beating on this, guys, but I just cannot for the life of me understand, when we got the most elite group on the face of the earth when it comes to protecting special folks. I don't know where they were that day.

So you start at 8:00. What time did you finish up? 10:00 at night.

A. Like midnight.

- Q. Midnight? Long day.
- A. And back out at 8 the next morning.
- Q. You guys are good. Thank you.

And I don't want to keep -- this is the one consistent thing that runs through this whole thing: Somebody's got to be in the booth.

Somebody's got to be in the booth calling out the next offensive play and the next defensive play to keep the offense from scoring.

I am just amazed that on that day, all that experience, all that training, all that prep work seemed to disappear. But it comes down to one person out of the thousands that were back and forth all over that field in the hottest day of the

summer. People collapsing. Right? But the only 1 2 one they remember is a guy in that outfit with a gray shirt and khaki pants, long hair. 3 4 The team's got a hell of a job in front 5 of it. No, we really do. We really do. We really do. 6 7 Officer, good job. Good job. Good job. Thank you, sir.
