Please produce all records in the possession, custody, or control of DHS, USSS, or any officer or employee thereof, in unredacted form:

- 1. Any briefing materials, written testimony, prepared remarks, and handouts prepared for and/or provided to Members of Congress or congressional staff during, or in connection with any hearings, briefings, press events, or any private or public events referring or related to the July 13 event, including the timeline of events as described during a briefing for Task Force staff on August 15, 2024.
- 2. All transcripts from interviews conducted by DHS and USSS related to the July 13 event.
- 3. An organizational chart showing the structural chains of command between or among all USSS divisions and teams involved in the planning of the July 13 event and present at the July 13 event, including subgroups within the Special Operations Division.
- 4. A list of all internal inquiries and/or reports that are underway within DHS and USSS related to the July 13 event, and a list of the targeted completion dates for such inquiries and/or reports.
 - a. Please provide any such reports that are final, including but not limited to any Unusual Protective Event (UPE) report.
- 5. The following information referring or related to the USSS's site selection process:
 - a. Any written policies or procedures, including the scope of the USSS's authority to approve, alter, or reject protectees' proposed site selections;
 - b. Any communications, including emails, text messages, phone logs, or communications from other messaging services related to the site selection process for the July 13 event; and
 - c. A list of DHS and USSS personnel responsible for the site selection process for the July 13 event.
- 6. The following information referring or related to the USSS's security plan for outdoor campaign events for a candidate for President:
 - a. Any written policies or procedures, including with respect to the establishment of security perimeter(s) and the allocation of responsibility between USSS and state and local law enforcement partners with respect to those perimeter(s);
 - b. Any written security plan for the July 13 event, including but not limited to securing the roof of the AGR building;

- c. A complete list of non-DHS and non-USSS entities present at the July 13 event, including other federal agencies, state law enforcement entities, and local law enforcement and emergency services entities.

 - a. Any written policies or procedures, including with respect to communications with state and local law enforcement partners and with respect to the quantity, composition, and interoperability of USSS and state or local law enforcement command posts;
 - b. Any written USSS communication plan for the July 13 event;
 - c. Any communications, including emails, text messages, phone logs, or communications from other messaging services, related to the USSS's communications structure at the July 13 event; and
 - d. A list of DHS and USSS personnel responsible for the USSS's communications structure at the July 13 event.
- 9. The following information referring or related to the USSS's counter sniper capabilities:

- a. Any written policies or procedures, including governing whether a USSS counter sniper team is present at an event as well as typical allocation of counter sniper responsibilities between USSS and state or local law enforcement partners;
- b. Any written USSS counter sniper plan for the July 13 event;
- c. Any communications, including emails, text messages, phone logs, or communications from other messaging services, related to the USSS's counter sniper plan and the execution of its counter sniper responsibilities at the July 13 event, including with respect to line-of-sight concerns; and
- d. A list of DHS and USSS personnel responsible for the USSS's counter sniper plan at the July 13 event.
- 10. The following information referring or related to the USSS's countersurveillance capabilities:
 - a. Any written policies or procedures, including governing whether a USSS countersurveillance team is present at an event;

 - c. A list of DHS and USSS personnel responsible for deciding whether a USSS countersurveillance team would be present at the July 13 event.
- 11. The following information referring or related to the USSS's Counter-Unmanned Aerial Surveillance (C-UAS) capabilities:
 - a. Any written policies or procedures, including the typical pre-deployment checklist to ensure that C-UAS devices are functional prior to deployment;
 - b. Any communications including emails, text messages, phone logs, or communications from other messaging services, related to the functionality and deployment of USSS C-UAS systems at the July 13 event; and
 - c. A list of DHS and USSS personnel responsible for the deployment and operation of USSS C-UAS systems at the July 13 event.
- 12. The following information referring or related to the USSS's counter improvised explosive devices (IEDs) capabilities:
 - a. Any written policies or procedures, including the typical breadth of counter explosive sweeps at an outdoor event;

- b. Any communications including emails, text messages, phone logs, or communications from other messaging services, related to the USSS's anti-IED sweeps or activities at the July 13 event; and
- c. A list of DHS and USSS personnel responsible for the USSS's anti-IED sweeps or activities at the July 13 event.

 - e. Manpower requests and briefings;

- f. Counter Sniper Logistics, including perimeter and boundary information;
- g. Counter Surveillance;
- h. Police Briefings, including police briefing sheets found in the Advance Documents system and Police Meeting Sign-In Sheets (SSF 3253), and any briefing by Butler County Emergency Services (Butler ESU);
- i. Site selection;
- j. Incident Reporting Protocols;
- k. Intelligence information;
- 1. USSS memoranda;
- m. Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) between DHS or USSS with other federal agencies; and
- n. Policies and practices regarding disciplinary offenses and penalties.
- 17. All documents and communications referring or relating to Donald J. Trump for President 2024, Inc. requests for USSS assets that were denied for the July 13 event, including but not limited to magnetometers, additional USSS agents, and counter snipers.

All documents and communications referring or relating to USSS personnel awareness of Thomas Matthew Crooks' presence at the July 13 event, including general awareness of a suspicious person that was ultimately identified as Mr. Crooks, as well as any other suspicious individuals identified as potentially connected to the shooting or Mr. Crooks.
- 19. A description of the number of USSS personnel assigned to the protective detail (inner perimeter or "shift") of the following protectees:
 - a. President of the United States (POTUS);
 - b. First Lady of the United States (FLOTUS);
 - c. Vice President of the United States (VP); and
 - d. Donald J. Trump.
- 20. All documents and communications referring or relating to FLOTUS's event in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania on July 13, 2024, including but not limited to the following:
 - a. Advance paperwork stored on USSS Advance Documents system;

All documents and communications between and among the Office of Professional Responsibilities, including the Inspection Division, referring or relating to U.S. Secret Service personnel or other U.S. Department of Homeland Security personnel who were assigned to the U.S. Secret Service on July 13, 2024, who have been placed on any type of leave, including, but not limited to administrative and restrictive leave, related to the events of July 13, 2024.

- 4. USSS Donald Trump Protective Division Special Agent in Charge;
- 5. USSS Donald Trump Protective Division Assistant Special Agent in Charge;
- 6. USSS Donald Trump Protective Division Site Agent for the July 13 rally;
- 7. USSS Lead Advance Agent;
- 8. The USSS agent(s) in command at the July 13 event; and
- 9. The USSS agent(s) responsible for the following areas:
 - a. Site selection for the July 13 event;
 - b. The overall USSS security plan at the July 13 event;
 - c. The USSS intelligence advance process for the July 13 event;
 - d. The USSS communications structure at the July 13 event;
 - e. USSS counter sniper capabilities at the July 13 event;
 - f. USSS counter surveillance capabilities at the July 13 event;
 - g. USSS Counter-Unmanned Aerial Surveillance (C-UAS) capabilities at the July 13 event;
 - h. USSS anti-improvised explosive devices (IEDs) capabilities at the July 13 event; and
 - i. Securing former President Trump in the midst and aftermath of the July 13 shooting.
