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: Today is September 12th,

2024, and this is a transcribed interview of

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House Resolution 1367 directed this Task

Force to investigate the facts and circumstances of the attempted assassination of Donald J. Trump on July 13th, 2024, in Butler, Pennsylvania. Pursuant to House Resolution 1367, Chairman Kelly and Ranking Member Crow have requested this interview as part of the Task Force investigation.

## BY :

- Q. Can the witness please state their name and spell their last name for the record.
  - A. . . .
  - Q. Thank you,

My name is \_\_\_\_\_\_, and I'm a Senior Counsel with the Task Force Majority Staff. I want to thank you for coming in today for this interview. The Task Force recognizes and appreciates that you are here voluntarily.

You are allowed to have an attorney present to advise you during this interview. Do you have an attorney representing you in a personal capacity present with you today?

A. Yes, sir.

Will the Counsel please 1 identify themselves for the record. 2 3 Yes. My name is 4 Last name is spelled 5 BY 6 Q. Is there also an attorney representing the 7 Zelienople Borough here today? There is not. 8 Α. Next, starting with Majority 9 10 and then Minority, can the additional staff members 11 please introduce themselves with their name, title, and affiliation. 12 13 14 Senior Counsel, Task Force Majority. 15 Investigative Counsel, Task Force Minority. 16 17 , Task Force Minority, also Investigative Counsel. 18 19 Thank you, all. 20 ΒY 21 , before we begin, I would like Q. 22 to go over the ground rules for this interview. The way this interview will proceed is 23 24 The Majority and Minority Staff will as follows: 25 alternate asking you questions, 30 minutes per side per round until each sides is finished their questioning. The Majority Staff will begin and proceed for 30 minutes, and then the Minority Staff will have 30 minutes to ask questions. We will then alternate back and forth in this manner until both sides have no more questions.

Do you understand?

A. Yes.

Q. If either side is in the middle of a specific line of questions, they may choose to end a few minutes past an hour to ensure completion of that specific line of questioning, including any pertinent follow-ups. In this interview, while one member of the staff for each side may lead the questioning, additional staff may ask questions.

There is a court reporter taking down everything I say and everything you say to make a written record of the interview. For the record to be clear, please wait until the staffer questioning you finishes each question before you begin your answer and the staffer will wait until you finish your response before proceeding to the next question.

Further, to ensure the court reporter can properly record this interview, speak clearly,

concisely, and slowly. Also, the court reporter cannot record non-verbal answers such as nodding or shaking your head; so, it's important that you answer each question with an audible, verbal answer.

Do you understand?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. We want you to answer our questions in the most complete and truthful manner possible; so we will take our time. If you have any questions or do not fully understand the question, please let us know. We will attempt to clarify, add context to, or rephrase our questions.

Do you understand?

- A. Yes.
- Q. If we ask about specific conversations or events in the past and you are unable to recall the exact words or details, you should testify to the substance of those conversations or events to the best of your recollection. If you recall only part of the conversation or event, you should give us your best recollection of those events or parts of conversations that you do recall.

Do you understand?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Although you are here voluntarily and we will not swear you in, you are required pursuant to 18 U.S. Code Section 1001 to answer questions from Congress truthfully. This also applies to questions posed by congressional staff in an interview.

Do you understand?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. If at any time you knowingly make false statements, you could be subject to criminal prosecution.

Do you understand?

- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Is there any reason you are unable to provide testimony at today's interview?
  - A. No.
- Q. Please note that if you wish to assert a privilege over any statement today, that assertion must comply with the Rules of the U.S. House of Representatives. For the Chair to consider assertions of privilege over testimony or statements, witnesses or entities must clearly state the specific privilege being asserted and the reason for the assertion on or before the scheduled date of testimony or appearance.

Do you understand?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Finally, I would like to note the content of what we discuss today is confidential. We ask that you do not speak about what we discuss here today in this interview to any outside individual in order to preserve the integrity of the investigation.

For these same reasons, the marked exhibits used today will be provided to the court reporter so they may go into the official transcript, and any copies of those exhibits will be returned to us when we wrap up.

We plan to take a five-minute break at the end of each 30 minutes of questioning, but if you need a longer break or a break before that, please let us know, and we are happy to accommodate. However, to the extent that there is a pending question, we would ask that you finish the question before we take a break.

Do you understand?

- A. Yes.
- Q. Do you have any other questions before we begin?
- A. No.

It is now 4:15. 1 The Majority Staff will now begin its questioning. 2 3 4 Ο. , as an initial matter, can you outlay for us your job description and explain to 5 us the delineation between the Zelienople Borough 6 7 and the Butler Emergency Services Unit. With Butler County ESU, I'm deputy 8 Yeah. 9 commander. I am number two under the commander, 10 My job description is just simply to assist 11 him in any jobs that he's working on or he 12 delegates to me. 13 I am employed through Zelienople Police 14 Department, Zelienople Borough, and I am on Butler 15 County ESU through that agency. 16 O. Thank you, sir. 17 On July 13th, in what capacity were you working for, Butler ESU or Zelienople Police 18 19 Department? 20 Α. On July 13th, I was there with Butler 21 County ESU as the deputy commander. 22 Q. When did you first learn about the July 13th event? 23 24 My initial notification was on July 5th. Α.

And how did you receive that --

Ο.

I received a --1 Α. 2 -- information? 0. I received a text message from Butler 3 4 County ESU Bravo Squad Leader I would like to introduce 5 Majority Exhibit 1 into the record. 6 7 (Majority Exhibit No. 1 was marked for identification.) 8 Do you recognize this document? 9 0. 10 Yes, I do. Α. 11 This document is titled "Butler ESU Q. 12 Presidential Rally Detail Overview of Planning 13 Operation." It lists a time line and maps 14 summarizing the events of July 13th. 15 So, on July 5th, you received a text 16 message that there will be a rally. Can you walk 17 us through the next steps after you received that 18 text message. 19 The next steps -- the next steps 20 immediately after that message that I received 21 about the rally was it was simply a -- a question of who would be 22 from Squad Leader able to attend an initial rally briefing that was 23 24 going to be later held on July 8th. 25 Uh-huh. And did you attend that meeting? Q.

A. I did.

- Q. Do you recall who was present?
- A. All assisting agencies were present at that meeting.
  - Q. Was the Secret Service at that meeting?
  - A. Yes. They led the meeting.
  - Q. Do you recall who from the Secret Service led that meeting?
    - A. I do. It was Special Agent .
  - Q. And what information was communicated by Special Agent at that meeting?
  - A. Special Agent , she led the meeting.

    She -- she started meeting with an I would say about 15-, 20-minute PowerPoint presentation: basic information, their team information, time line of events, different equipment, different assets that they would bring for the day of the event.

It was different slides to identify different members throughout the Secret Service and what their duties and what their responsibilities would be on that day. It was, like I said, very simple, very brief, maybe 15 minutes. And from that briefing, we were then directed to, by her, to break off into she called them breakout sessions

with specific roles and responsibilities in different groups of what our job descriptions were going to be on the day of the event.

- Q. If you recall, do you remember the different types of breakout groups that existed?
- A. Yeah. Well, mine specifically was I was supposed to meet with Allegheny County SWAT team, Pennsylvania State Police SWAT -- CERT, I'm sorry -- Secret Service Counter Assault Team, and I'm missing one here. Yeah. So it was Butler ESU, Pennsylvania CERT, Allegheny County SWAT, and Secret Service. That's all of them. That was my group specifically.

Others were broken down into like

Pennsylvania State Police and Butler Township

Police were off in their own separate group having their own discussion. Emergency Services, EMA, were off in their own group having their own discussion. It was just specialty groups throughout the room.

- Q. Uh-huh. And what was the purpose of your specific breakout group?
- A. The purpose of my group was, with the agencies that I identified who were within my group, was it was just a very quick, very short

exchange of information of what our roles and responsibilities were going to be for that day.

And just, in short, Allegheny County

SWAT was responsible for Pittsburgh International

Airport. Pennsylvania State Police CERT was

responsible for all transportation to and from the

airport. Butler County ESU's specific mission was

actually given after that breakout group, and we

can go into that next step here.

Q. Uh-huh.

2.0

- A. But that's -- that's how that went.
- Q. As a clarifying question, can you explain what Pennsylvania State Police CERT means.
  - A. Yeah. That's how they identified their SWAT team. Allegheny County identifies themself as SWAT. Pennsylvania CERT, that's their version of saying they're a SWAT team. And then just like with Butler County ESU, that's how we identify each -- each agency.
    - Q. Understood.
    - A. Yeah.
  - Q. So after that breakout meeting, what -- what did you understand what was being tasked of you for the July 13th event?
    - A. From that meeting -- well, very

importantly, before I exited that breakout group, I received a piece of paper with a handwritten note on it with a name of a Secret Service agent that I was to make contact with, and his name was \_\_\_\_\_\_, and it provided his phone number.

- Q. And for what purpose were you receiving that paper with that name?
- A. That would come after. I left that meeting. I then met with Special Agent and then Special Agent , and that's when I received our Butler County ESU's mission for the day, the day of the event.
- Q. What did you understand the Butler County ESU mission to be for July 13th?
- A. From that meeting, they asked that we provide two CAT teams, counter assault teams, six to eight members on each team, and then one QRF, Quick Reaction Force, of four to six members.
  - Q. Uh-huh.

A. And it was basically our -- the way it was explained to me from Special Agent and was the CAT teams were responsible to mobilize only in the event that there was going to be an attack on the venue or on the candidate himself, and QRF was just to assist those elements as needed if we

were mobilized. 1 2 Understood. Q. And this communication to you by Special 3 4 and Special Agent occurred at the 5 July 8th in-person meeting; correct? 6 Α. Yes. 7 Ο. Thank you. 8 Were you the only representative from Butler ESU at that July 8th 9 10 meeting? 11 THE WITNESS: Yes. 12 0. Referring to Majority Exhibit 1, on Page 3 13 it reads that on July 9th at 12:03 hours, Commander 14 received a phone call from USSS Agent from the Secret Service Counter Assault Unit. 15 16 Agent clarified that he was requesting two counter assault teams of at least six persons for 17 the rally. The counter assault teams would be 18 19 dedicated solely to the asset in the event of a 20 coordinated assault. explained that ESU would 21 also provide a QRF that would respond to a lone 22 actor or a lone active shooter at the event in 23 addition to the two counter assault teams. 24 Were you aware of this phone call the

day after the July 8 in-person meeting where this

similar information was communicated to you? 1 2 Yes. And I was aware of the phone call. I Α. can't say exactly when --3 4 Ο. Uh-huh. 5 Α. -- I was aware of it. But Commander did -- did give me that information. 6 7 Uh-huh. After that phone call occurred and Ο. 8 you spoke or communicated with Commander , did you understand that your mission for July 13th 9 10 would change at all? 11 Α. At that time, no. 12 Q. Leading up to July 13th, did you attend or 13 participate in any additional walk-throughs or briefings related to the July 13th event? 14 July 11th at 10:00 hours, we did a 15 Α. Yes. walk-through of the Butler Farm Show. 16 17 And who was present at the walk-through of 0. the Butler Farm Show? 18 19 Again, I believe all assist agencies were 20 there as well. 21 Uh-huh. Can you describe what the 0. 22 walk-through entailed in terms of where you 23 traveled on the Butler Farm Show ground that day. 24 Yeah. We -- initially, we met at the Brady Α. 25 Paul Lodge, that's off Brady Paul Lane. Like I

said, all agencies were there. I would describe it 1 2 as kind of disorganized, unorganized. Just a large group of agencies from -- members from different 3 4 agencies kind of just gathering around just waiting for some direction. 5 Commander and I had a brief 6 7 discussion with Special Agent , 8 I do believe Commander did have an extended discussion with them beyond my initial 9 10 discussion. Of what that was, I don't know. 11 And, again, from there, I just was 12 advised by and Special Agent that --13 about the counter assault teams and the positioning of the teams and, again, what the responsibility 14 were of the teams. 15 16 At the time of that walk-through, had you Ο. had communications with \_\_\_\_\_ from the Secret 17 Service who you received contact information about 18 19 at that earlier meeting on July 8th? 2.0 Α. At that time, at the walk-through --21 Ο. Yes. 22 Α. -- at 10:00? No. 23 Okay. Ο. I will -- later in that day, I received 24 25 information from Special Agent , but that was

1 communicated through . It was a few hours 2 after, if that's where you're going. 3 Ο. Yes. 4 Α. Okay. 5 Q. So, I believe around 1:30 in the afternoon, on Majority Exhibit 1, there's a time stamp 6 7 description of 13:23 hours. It reads, Commander received another phone call from SA 8 9 and confirmed my understanding of the counter 10 assault team request. Special Agent also asked 11 if we could assign an operator to his team, which 12 consists of two Secret Service counter assault operators, to ensure continuity of communications. 13 confirmed that we would do so, and we 14 15 discussed how and where our operator would link up 16 with the counter assault team arriving with the 17 also provided SA with the motorcade. contact information of our operator, Deputy 18 19 Commander , who he would be linking up with. 2.0 Α. Let me see here. Got it. Okay. I'm -- I 21 got it. 22 Q. Thank you. 23 Α. Yep. After that phone call from to , did 24 25 you receive an update on your responsibilities for

the July 13th event?

A. Yes, sir, I did. That was -- at that time, we were -- that was -- we left the rally site from the initial walk-through, we went to Butler Township's police station. We were just planning operations for the day of the event, and I -- I do recall Commander taking that phone call, and then after the phone call, him looking over at me and saying, "Hey, you are now assigned with the counter assault team. There will be two members, and they will make contact with you the day of the event and they explained your assignment that day."

- Q. Did Commander explain the communications element that was discussed in that phone call, according to Majority Exhibit 1?
- A. Yes, he did. Yeah, he told me I would be

  -- he briefly explained that I would just be a

  direct link from Butler ESU to Secret Service

  counter assault.
- Q. On the day of July 13th, there was a local law enforcement meeting at Brady Paul. Looking at Majority Exhibit 1, that occurred at July -- that occurred at 9:30 hours.

what "tactical assets" mean.

- A. Tactical assets in our -- our line of work is -- that could be a range from individual operators, police officers. And assets as far as vehicles we might use, any type of equipment we might use, any type of communications we might use. That's how I would describe "assets."

  Q. Okay. At 9:30 hours on Majority Exhibit 1,
- Q. Okay. At 9:30 hours on Majority Exhibit 1 it reads that the operational plan was changed at the briefing as Beaver County ESU was able to supply more tactical operators than previously expected. This resulted in Washington Regional SWAT operators being moved to assist with the QRF instead of Beaver's ESU counter assault team.

Did this operational change affect your responsibilities on July 13th?

- A. Mine specifically?
- O. Yes.

- A. No, it did not.
- Q. At that meeting in the morning at 9:30, were any concerns raised about the campaign rally site or any concerns about the plan for that day?
- A. No, there were no concerns. And I -- I specifically remember at the end of our -- once the brief was delivered by \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, I forced a team leader meeting separate from the initial

briefing to ensure that everybody clearly 1 2 understood their job responsibilities and their mission. 3 We did that, and, again, it went without 4 5 question, to the best of my knowledge. I would like to enter another 6 0. Uh-huh. 7 exhibit into the record. This will be Majority Exhibit 2. 8 (Majority Exhibit No. 2 was marked for 9 identification.) 10 11 Do you recognize this document? 12 Α. Yes, I do. This document reads, "Butler ESU Donald J. 13 Trump Detail." Can you describe this document for 14 15 us and what purpose it served for July 13th. 16 This document here is just -- it's Α. Yeah. our operational brief for the event, and then it 17 just simply within contains all information, all 18 19 job responsibilities, and all missions that all 20 members were responsible for. 21 Did you have a role in preparing this 0. 22 document? 23 I did not prepare this document, but I 24 reviewed it prior to it being pushed out to the

entire group, yes.

1	Q. And when was this document disseminated to
2	other members of Butler ESU and law enforcement
3	entities?
4	A. It was one second here. Can I have a
5	second here?
6	Q. Of course.
7	A. All right. It's on 7/12/2024 at 23:42
8	hours, got an e-mail from Commander . He sent
9	this (indicating) operational plan to Deputy
10	Commander and Team Leader .
11	Q. Thank you. On Page 7 of the Majority
12	Exhibit 2, Butler ESU Donald J. Trump Detail
13	PowerPoint, there's a section that's labeled
14	"Execution."
15	A. Okay.
16	Q. And it describes the location of Butler
17	County ESU counter assault team and QRF team. It
18	looks like this (indicating).
19	: I'm showing the picture.
20	: Do you want me to give
21	him mine?
22	: Yes.
23	: It's easier. It's
24	numbered.
25	THE WITNESS: Okay. Yeah. This isn't

1 numbered here. All right. I got it. 2 : You can keep this one. 3 THE WITNESS: Keep it? 4 Yeah. It's numbered. 5 BY 6 Can you describe where you were located on Q. 7 this map. If you're looking at the map here, 8 just as you're looking at it, I was directly behind 9 10 where the main stage was in the white barn, and 11 it's the white barn above where it's "BUTLER ESU" 12 highlighted in yellow. 13 So by right above that barn, do you mean 14 behind the barn? 15 Α. Directly behind the barn. 16 Thank you. Ο. 17 And how many operators from Butler ESU were behind the barn with you on July 13th? 18 19 Behind the barn on July 13th? 20 Approximately, I would say there was 15, 16 Butler 21 ESU members behind there. 22 Is that a combination of the counter 23 assault team and quick reaction team? 24 There was -- it was a mix of the counter

assault team with the QRF team mixed within that,

and then there were also tactical medicine officers in and about that area also. Probably 3, 4, maybe

5. That's separate from that 16 number I gave you.

- Q. Uh-huh. And what was your responsibility with that group that day?
- A. My responsibility with that group that day was just to stand by with them. Again, in case there was some type of an attack or some type of coordinated attack or event on the venue itself, we were, again, to mobilize.

I knew that a -- that a specific -- that at a certain time during that day of the event, I was going to break off from that group, and I had a separate job description. I would have a separate job description at that time.

From the 11:00 hour until that time, we just gathered around, remained in our equipment, in our gear. We went over different contingencies and different responsibilities we might have if certain things would happen, and that's common what we do when we stand by.

Q. Uh-huh. And you mentioned you would break off from that group at a time during the day and pursue another responsibility. Can you describe that for us.

A. Yeah. Again, I was directed by Commander

that Special Agent CAT Team Leader

will contact me that day by my cell -- using my

cell phone, and at that time, he would instruct me

where to position myself in relation to where the

motorcade was going to enter the rally site.

Q. Uh-huh. Upon the entering of the motorcade

into the campaign rally site, what would -- what

responsibilities would you assume?

A. My initial instructions were to position myself between the main stage and the holding tent that they were going to bring the candidate -- place the candidate into, and he very -- he strongly suggested that he wanted me out of sight. He wanted me out of view of the motorcade.

And then once the motorcade was in place, once the candidate was inside the holding tent, he would then make contact with me in person.

- Q. Okay. Do you recall about what time you made first contact with the Secret Service on July 13th?
  - A. With Special Agent ?
- Q. Secret Service. Any official from Secret Service.
  - A. I had contact after the 11:00 hour with

Special Agent . She did report to the -- to the barn behind the main stage where the CAT team was positioned, and I don't -- I don't truly understand what she was doing other than maybe just getting her eyes on, you know, what assets were in place, where everybody was. I did not talk to her, but I did have -- I did visually see her.

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As far as communication with -- with special -- the Secret Service, I -- I received a phone call from Special Agent at 16:19 hours.

- Q. What did you understand Special Agent role to be that day?
- A. He was the lead operator for their counter assault team, which was a counter assault team of two Secret Service agents.
- Q. Did you expect that there would be more Secret Service counter assault agents there?
  - A. I guess -- expected anything? I -- no.
- Q. Okay. Referring to Majority Exhibit 1, at approximately 17:32 hours, the motorcade arrived at the Butler Farm Show grounds. Approximately ten minutes after that time, 17:42:58 hours, Beaver ESU S/O reported that there was a younger white male, long hair, lurking around the AGR building.

He was viewed with a rangefinder sighting the 1 2 stage, and he believed that he was looking up at the S/O units inside the second floor. 3 4 lost sight of the male after he 5 walked around the side of the building, and also reported that there was a bicycle with a large 6 7 backpack sitting next to it near the rear of the building that was not there earlier? 8 Do you recall hearing the report from 9 10 Beaver ESU S/O that there was this individual 11 at all on the radios? 12 Α. Yes, sir, I did hear it on the channel I 13 was on. 14 Were you in proximity to Secret Service at Ο. 15 that time? 16 I was not. Α. Do you recall being in proximity with 17 Secret Service while there were reports of 18 19 suspicious individuals being radioed over 20 communications for that day? 21 Α. Will you ask me -- ask me that again, 22 please. 23 Ο. Of course. Do you recall being in 24 proximity of Secret Service simultaneously while 25 hearing reports of suspicious individuals at the

1 rally grounds that day? 2 Α. Yes. Do you recall when you were in proximity 3 Ο. 4 with Secret Service? 5 Α. My first contact with Secret Service was at 17:52 hours. 6 7 And was that in person or was that over the Ο. radio? 8 That's when I was physically met by 9 Α. Special Agent , and he positioned me inside a 10 11 black SUV in the motorcade. It was in between 12 the -- the main stage and the barn. 13 And what was the purpose of that positioning? 14 15 Again, he -- I think he wanted to keep me Α. out of sight. They put me in the rear of the SUV. 16 17 The two special agents that were assigned to the CAT team were still working something outside of 18 19 the vehicle inside the tent. 2.0 So I did remain in the vehicle by myself 21 for a period of time, and then at -- at one point, 22 both agents did enter the SUV. All three of us were inside the armored vehicle. 23 24 Do you recall discussing this suspicious 25 individual with Special Agent

A. Not in great detail. But I -- we had a discussion of -- overview of the events of the day and how the day was going.

I did -- I did communicate to them that there were -- there was some activity outside of the rally site, outside of the perimeter, and I

there were -- there was some activity outside of the rally site, outside of the perimeter, and I informed them that local -- local police, state police and sheriffs, were working that -- currently working that -- that issue.

- Q. Do you recall about what time you had that communication?
- A. It was about the -- that -- that 17:52 hour that we initially met. I -- there wasn't so much of a delay of me communicating to them what was going on for the day.
- Q. Uh-huh. So, around that time, 17:52, that you're in contact with Special Agent, you were advised to move your location to inside the vehicle; correct?
  - A. Yes.

- Q. And did you remain in that vehicle through the time that shots were fired?
- A. No. I -- I was outside of the vehicle behind the main stage in a holding tent at the time when shots were fired.

	Q. And what was the purpose of your move
2	location then?
3	A. That was just our position to just to be in
4	a more efficient, better location to react in case
5	of an attack. And like I said, again, it was
6	directly behind the the main stage.
7	Q. Were you advised to move your location from
8	the vehicle to that location near the stage?
9	A. Yes. I was told to exit. Special Agent
LO	and both exited the vehicle, and I was to
L1	go with them, and I did.
L2	Q. Did they explain what purpose of your
L3	movement?
L4	A. As I just stated, it was just to position
L5	ourselves to re to have a better position to
L6	react in case of an attack.
L7	Q. Okay. Do you recall about what time that
L8	occurred?
L9	A. What time we moved?
20	Q. Yeah.
21	A. I don't.
22	: What were the names of
23	the other Secret Service agents on the CAT team?
24	THE WITNESS: It was Special Agent
25	and then Special Agent . I'm not sure what

1 his first name was. His last name was Was it just those two 2 individuals? 3 4 THE WITNESS: Yes. 5 We're approaching time for 6 the Majority's first round of questioning, and I'm 7 going to go off the record. (Discussion was held off the record.) 8 9 BY 10 Would you mind just walking us through your Ο. 11 background and career, just giving a little bit of 12 a background. Background, 17 years in law 13 Yeah. enforcement total. 13 full-time years currently 14 15 with the Zelienople Borough Police Department. I was a patrolman for many years. I have been a -- I 16 17 was a sergeant for 5 years. I've been a lieutenant for 3 months. And I have been on the Butler County 18 19 ESU team for 8 years now, and I had started as an 20 operator, I was a squad leader, and then I, in my 21 most recent role, as a deputy commander. 22 Congratulations on your promotion to 23 lieutenant three months ago. 24 Thank you. Α.

Do you have any prior military experience?

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- 1 Α. I do. Marine Corps. 2 Marine Corps. How many years? Q. Almost six. 3 Α. 4 Ο. And what did you for the Marines? 5 Α. I did two separate MOSs. I did some motor 6 transport stuff and then some infantry, heavy 7 weapons-type stuff. 8 And were you ever deployed? I was in Iraq in 2005; '05 to '06. 9 Α. Yes. 10 was in Fallujah, Iraq. 11 Fallujah in '05-'06. Thank you for your Q.
  - Q. Fallujah in '05-'06. Thank you for your service.
    - A. Thank you.

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- Q. What is the administrative process to go from your lieutenant position to your position as the PD commander for Butler ESU? Is it an e-mail that is sent? Is there a specific TACON/OPCON shift? Is there kind of a process that you have to follow to be fulfilling those shoes opposed to your current ones?
- A. Can you ask me that differently? You kind of lost me right in the beginning.
  - Q. No. Absolutely.

Is there a specific process that needs to happen every time you go from your lieutenant

shoes to your deputy commander shoes, or is it just 1 2 an e-mail request, your police station approves it, and then you're operating as deputy commander of 3 Butler ESU? 4 5 Α. I'm trying to understand your question. То make it make sense, maybe, the best way to put it 6 7 is I'm always lieutenant with Zelienople Police 8 Department. Uh-huh. 9 0. 10 I'm always a deputy commander with Butler Α. 11 County ESU. 12 Q. Okay. There's no, like, off time for either. 13 Α. Does that make sense? 14 15 That makes complete sense. Q. 16 Α. Okay. 17 So when you were operating with one, Butler Ο. 18 ESU, do you have to get approval to be able to do 19 that, or do you -- is there a system? 20 Α. I'm in a position within my police 21 department where I -- I am the one to authorize the 22 permission to do it. 23 Ο. Okay. 24 There's two other members in my police

department that are under me that have to go

Α.

through me to request permission for trainings, 1 2 different jobs that we do, stuff like that. But I -- I, from my police chief, I make 3 4 my own decisions on where I go and what I do. communicate -- I do communicate with him where I'm 5 at, what I'm doing, though, at all times. 6 7 Okay. Makes sense. Ο. Have you had any experience working 8 other rallies before the 13 July? 9 10 Α. One, in 2020. 11 And what was your role at that rally? 12 Α. My role at that time was the same. I was 13 the deputy commander. 14 Do you have experience with other security details? 15 16 Α. No. 17 What is your experience like coordinating with PSP or other federal agencies? 18 19 I've worked with PSP my entire law 20 enforcement career through trainings, through 21 on-the-job experiences. 22 As far as federal agencies, I do have experience working with them. It's -- I would say 23 24 it's limited compared to the Pennsylvania State

Police. I've worked with FBI, the DEA, Secret

Service, Attorney General's Office. I've done a 1 2 lot of work with them. Or not a lot of work with federal agencies, but some. 3 4 Ο. Some? 5 Α. Yeah. So, turning to the planning of the 6 Q. Okay. 7 13 July event, when Butler ESU says, hey, we're 8 standing up for an event, we need some support from Washington, from Beaver, whoever it might be, who 9 10 is generally the point of contact for coordinating 11 all of that support? 12 Α. With Butler ESU? 13 For Butler ESU. Ο. 14 Α. Commander 15 Q. 16 Α. Yes. 17 So is that process that sends an Ο. 18 e-mail, does he have to go through anybody, or does 19 he just reach out commander to commander and say, 20 we need X support? 21 Well, he reached out to his two assistant Α. 22 commanders and then our team leaders, and then knowing that we needed additional support from two 23 other SWAT teams, he had to go above him, and 24 25 that -- that was . He's the Butler

911 coordinator for Butler County. So he couldn't 1 2 just make that request on his own. 3 Ο. Okay. 4 Α. So --5 Q. So is the individual that 6 coordinates the various entities supporting Butler 7 ESU? He's the one that's --He was the one -- he's the one that has the 8 9 authority to sort of request the other teams to 10 assist us. 11 Okay. Do you know, did the U.S. Secret Q. 12 Service know that that authority rested with 13 14 I don't know. Α. 15 Okay. Now, in the op plan provided by Q. Butler, it does say that the radios are provided by 16 17 county EMA. What is EMA? Just our emergency services group for the 18 19 county, and they provide, just as it says, the 20 radios and different types of equipment. 21 also involved with Q. And is 22 county EMA? 23 He is the lead rep for EMA. 24 He is? Q. Okay. 25 Did you or anyone else have to go

through a vetting process to be able to support at 1 2 a presidential rally? 3 Α. No. 4 Ο. Did you have input on what your role was going to be for the rally? 5 6 Α. Yes. 7 Did at any point the U.S. Secret Service Ο. ask how many members of Butler ESU were available 8 for the July 13th rally? 9 10 Α. I was asked more than once, and my 11 answer was the same both times. I said, 12 "Approximately 25 members." 13 And how many members of Butler ESU were 14 offered at the end of the day for the rally? 15 How many were there that day? Α. 16 Yes. Ο. I don't have a final number, Commander 17 Α. would, but it was definitely that 25 number. 18 19 Q. Okay. 2.0 Α. Minimum. 21 0. 25 minimum? 22 Α. Yes. 23 Ο. How does that compare to the number of 24 individuals deployed for Trump's 2020 visit that 25 you worked?

- A. From what I remember, we had less in 2020.
- Q. I understand that you were there for the July 8 meeting. I think I'm clear on that.

So, moving to the July 11 walk-through at Butler farm, do you recall whether the participants walked around fences to discuss any vulnerabilities or had conversations that anticipated any security changes?

- A. During the walk-through, we broke off into different groups. What the other groups did, I don't know. I --
  - Q. Okay.

- A. My group went to the -- to the barn behind the main stage. That's -- that's all I did.
- Q. Okay. So there was -- with your group, there was no walk-through of the entire farm, it was just straight to the barn for planning?
- A. It wasn't straight to the barn, but it was to -- it was to a location -- I was with a group of guys that we were looking for positions for the two counter assault teams, and then we -- we noted one position for the -- for the Beaver County team that was by the main entrance, and then the other counter assault team, which was Butler ESU, which was behind the main stage in the barn.

Okay. During your time during that July 1 Q. 2 11th walk-through, did you have any security concerns? 3 4 Α. I had a lot of concerns, but I -- that's 5 normal for me. 6 Did you communicate those concerns with 7 anyone? I did, yeah. I -- I specifically remember 8 asking about the water tower, and I was just told 9 10 it was covered. And that's kind of outside of my 11 area of responsibility. I'm not a sniper, I'm not 12 a sniper team leader, I'm not -- I don't have 13 sniper knowledge, so I just -- I leave that up to 14 them to make that plan. 15 Who -- when you communicated that, do you Q. remember what -- who you communicated that to? 16 17 I do. It was Butler County ESU sniper Α. He works for Butler Township. 18 19 Did you have any security concerns with 20 where the perimeter was set? 21 Yes, I did. It was specifically in Α. I did. 22 the area of the -- there was two -- two fence 23 lines, and then, of course, the -- the AGR building 24 and the water tower beyond that fence line, beyond

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the perimeter --

1 Ο. Uh-huh. 2 -- and, again, I was told that Pennsylvania State Police and Butler Township Police would be in 3 4 that area. Who told you that? 5 Q. 6 That was Special Agent . 7 Did you talk to Special Agent or any Ο. other Secret Service about why the decision was 8 made to leave AGR outside of the perimeter? 9 10 Α. No. We didn't -- I didn't go into great 11 detail about it. 12 Q. Do you know, what type of events are 13 typically held at Butler Farm? 14 I'm not going to have a great answer because I've never been there prior to that. 15 16 of the guys on the team love going there. I don't -- I think it's like animals and stuff. I don't 17 18 know. 19 Ο. Fair. Fair. 20 Okay. Moving to the op plan, Majority 21 Exhibit 2. Do you know, did the Secret Service at 22 all prior to the event sign off on this op plan? 23 Sign off? I don't believe they did. 24 So, turning to Page 4 of Majority Exhibit

2, this lays out what Butler County ESU was tasked

with. You've walked through what a counter assault team is and how many teams you had and where they were located.

Do you -- can you give us an example of when a counter assault team would be deployed.

- A. I'll give you the example for that day specifically. Our counter assault teams were to deploy their -- their words were mobilize in the event that there was an attack on the venue site or on the candidate.
- Q. What sort of an attack would have to happen?
- A. I believe the way it's understood for us, it could be like a lone-wolf-type actor or a -- something coordinated between multiple -- multiple people.
- Q. Okay. So, please correct me if I'm wrong, but my understanding is that the QRF would go for the lone wolf and the counter assault would go for the more coordinated --
  - A. Yes.

- Q. -- attack; is that correct?
- A. Yep, correct.
- Q. It does mention that the counter assault teams are dedicated and will not deviate from their

mission, but potentially the QRF team could deviate from their mission. Do you know why that distinction was made?

- A. The way I -- the way -- the easiest way for me to explain the QRF team, you said it exactly, they're just -- they're flexible. They're there to assist all -- all teams needed for -- for -- I mean, that could be anything for just additional operators, additional equipment, communications. That's their -- the QRF team is always flexible. It's not one specific mission.
- Q. Okay. Now, as you mentioned earlier, this op plan was finalized and sent out on 12 September [sic]. Between this document that we're looking at and what happened during the brief on the morning of 13 July, what changes were made to the op plan from 12 July to the morning of 13 July?
- A. The only changes that I recall were, it was stated earlier, that we -- Beaver ESU provided a few additional operators, and we were just able to place them with the second counter assault team by the -- by the main entrance.

And what that did, that freed up a couple of the operators from Washington that were there to come help with the QRF back behind the

1 main stage.

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- Q. Okay.
- A. Really what it did was strengthen our -- our mission plan for the day.
- Q. Do you know why, if additional bodies were available, why the decision wasn't made to send them over to the AGR building? Were you part of any discussion about the possibilities for what to do with those additional bodies?
  - A. No.
- Q. Okay. Did anyone from Butler ESU talk about -- and either at the 9 a.m. briefing or at a separate briefing -- the fact that U.S. Secret Service was going to have countersnipers at the event?
  - A. I had no discussions related to that, no.
- Q. Do you know from this, the Butler ESU op plan, it does refer to the teams as countersniper teams. Do you know why it's "countersniper" as opposed to just "sniper"?
  - A. No.
- Q. Okay.
- 23 | A. No.
- Q. Okay. Did you -- were you aware that there was going to be multiple command posts on 13 July?

- 1 Α. No. 2 When did you find out that there were multiple command posts? 3 4 Α. The morning of. 5 Q. Morning of. And in your experience, both your long career as law enforcement as well as your 6 7 military experience, would it be normal to have two command posts during an operation? 8 9 Α. That's not normal operating procedures. 10 Have you ever been part of an operation, Ο. 11 either in military experience or law enforcement,
  - A. No.

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- Q. And in the 2020 rally, do you know, was there one command post or two command posts?
- A. There was one. I was in it.

where there were two beyond this one?

- Q. What time did you arrive at the rally site?
  - A. The day of the event?
- 19 | Q. Yes.
- 20 A. 8:30. 08:30.
  - Q. How -- are you aware of Butler ESU offering the Secret Service any support the morning of July 13th -- or the day of July 13th I should say -- whether that be equipment, offensive or defensive?
    - A. I know they were offered communication,

radios. 1 Were they offered any drone equipment? 2 I believe they were. The specifics, I 3 But I do remember we made mention 4 don't have them. of it because we -- we've had our own -- we've used 5 drones ourselves for other operations. 6 7 Okay. So, the day of July -- the day of 0. the event on July 13th, did you have a radio? 8 9 Α. Yes. 10 How did you receive your radio? Ο. 11 Α. It's a radio that's been issued to me 12 through the county for years. 13 Okay. What channel were you on? Q. 14 I was on police operations 4 that day. Α. Is that commonly referred to as "ops 4"? 15 Q. 16 Ops 4, yes. Α. 17 Were you listening to any other channels Ο. throughout the day? 18 19 I was not. 20 Q. In your communications that day, did you 21 use text messages at all? 22 Α. Yes.

> Did you use signal? Q.

Who were you messaging?

Other Butler ESU members.

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I didn't send any messages that day, but I 1 Α. 2 received a few. Did you use e-mail at all? 3 Ο. 4 Α. I don't recall using e-mail for anything. Do you have FirstNet? 5 Q. I do not. 6 Α. 7 At any point on July 13th, did you see any Ο. drones? 8 I did not. 9 Α. 10 Do you recall where you were between 3:50 Ο. 11 and 4 p.m.? 12 Α. 3:50 and 4 p.m.? 13 Ο. Uh-huh. 14 I was at the barn. Α. Now, turning attention to kind of the time 15 Q. 16 line of when Secret Service and you connected. 17 So, at 17:52, that was the first time that you connected in person with Secret Service, 18 19 you were there with Special Agent and that correct? 20 21 Α. Yes. 22 And so at 17:52, you let them know that there was a suspicious person off-site near the AGR 23 24 building and local police had it handled? 25 Α. Yes. That, and then all the events of the

1 day. That wasn't the only --2 Q. Okay. -- information I gave them. I started from 3 4 the beginning of the day up until then, and just gave them a brief overview of all the different 5 6 jobs we were working throughout the day. 7 Okay. Was there anything else notable that Ο. you let the Secret Service know about in that 8 conversation? 9 10 Α. No. 11 And then at that point, at about 17:52, Q. 12 they asked you to get in the SUV, and so you were 13 in the SUV and they walked back into the tent? 14 Yes. Α. 15 About how long was the time frame when you 0. 16 were in the SUV and not co-located with them? An 17 approximation is --Approximately five minutes. 18 19 0. Five minutes? 20 So approximately three minutes before 21 18:00, they get back in the car, and then at what 22 point do you all leave the car to go to the tent?

A. Approximately another few minutes went by, three to five minutes, from there.

Approximation is fine.

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1 Q. Okay. And while you were all in the car 2 together, did you have any discussions about this 3 suspicious person? Again, I just gave them a brief overview of 4 5 what was going on for the day. I gave them just -like I said, just very, very briefly described to 6 7 them what was going on. And at that time, were you still listening 8 9 to the ops 4 channel? 10 Ops 4, yes. Α. 11 Okay. At any time throughout the day, were Q. 12 you not listening to ops 4? I had ops 4 all day. 13 All day. So how does that work as a law 14 0. 15 enforcement officer if you're having a 16 conversation? Your portable radio is there, 17 constant communication. Are you just very good at 18 multitasking? 19 We're wired to. We pick it up. 20 could -- yes. 21 Okay. So -- but you can hear what's coming Q. 22 through the radio all the time? 23 Α. Yes.

And you just pick it up and respond if

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necessary?

A. Yes.

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- Q. Okay. So, prior -- this is going to sound like a little bit of a silly question considering your background and military experience -- but prior to the rally, what did a rangefinder mean to you?
- A. The first thing that pops into my head, archery hunters use them.
- Q. Would hearing that someone had a rangefinder alert you to a threat?
  - A. I noted it when I heard it. It --
- 12 Q. Okay.
  - A. -- made an impression on me.
    - Q. It made an impression. Would that rise to the level where the QRF would have been deployed?

      Like, at what level would the QRF to go after a lone individual occur?
      - A. That -- just the report of a rangefinder does not deploy our QRF team.
        - Q. Okay.
  - A. That would -- that -- the responsibility would lie on local uniformed officers within and outside the perimeter. That would not mobilize our QRF team.
    - Q. Okay. What would an example be of

something that would create a situation in which it was appropriate to deploy the QRF team?

- A. Specifically that day, their -- their mission was to -- to move in the event of a lone wolf. That's how it was described to them.
  - O. Uh-huh.

- A. And then they were also tasked to, by the Secret Service, if any aerial drones were in or about the perimeter, non-friendly drones, that they would be killed. That's the terminology they used. When they drop out of the sky, the QRF would be responsible to respond to that location and recover them. That was it for that day.
- Q. Okay. Do you under -- do you know why -- I assume chain of command, it would have been

  Commander that would make the decision of when to deploy the QRF team, or were they given the authority to make that decision on their own?
- A. No. They would receive that through Commander .
- Q. Okay. And at any point after 17:52 when you were co-located with the Secret Service, did you have any discussions as to why Former President Trump -- whether or not he was going to be on stage knowing there was a suspicious person? Did you

ever discuss that, or were those not discussions that --

A. It was never mentioned.

- Q. Uh-huh. So, you were behind the main stage when you heard shots fired. What was the -- was there anything that was notable to you between 17:52 and shots fired that we haven't asked you about?
- A. The only additional information I would say is from where I was placed in the tent, at the time of shots fired -- just prior to that, I noticed that the two special agents, and , were -- they were paying attention to their radios too. I don't know what they heard.

Like, they didn't -- they couldn't hear what I was hearing, but they were -- their demeanors, their body, they were -- they were paying attention to what was coming through. So they were getting something. I don't know what it was.

- Q. Okay.
- A. Just like I was getting something also, they don't know what it was.
- Q. Okay. So, when you heard shots fired, can you walk us through what happened after that point.

A. Yeah. Shots fired for us, it was the two agents, me behind them. The exit to the tent was on the opposite side of the agents. We immediately responded directly to the stage, and just as discussed prior to us even being in that position, I knew as soon as I stepped outside of the tent was going to be the red catwalk that would lead us up to the main stage.

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I was told from the time I was in the SUV that I was to pair up with Special Agent in the event that we had to move, and the three of us exited the tent. Special Agent and I went left behind the main stage in the bleachers. We came around to the right side to the steps before getting up on stage, and then the other agent came around the opposite way. And that's just a tactical move that we discussed that we would do just for protection of the candidate and the detail members.

And I -- shortly after I made it up on stage with the other two agents, I took a knee at the back right corner of the stage. It was communicated to me through ops 4 that the threat was taken care of. I communicated that verbally to a group of agents that were on top of the

candidate, and then I was told to get down off of 1 2 the stage. And then at that time, I just basically 3 4 cleared and prepared the evacuation route, which I 5 knew that was my job description prior to even 6 deploying. That's what my job was for that day. 7 So, once you got off stage, you cleared and prepared the evacuation route, what happened? 8 I had -- I positioned myself between the 9 10 stage and the motorcade. We waited for the 11 candidate's detail to move him from the stage into 12 the motorcade, the armored vehicles. And then from 13 there, we left. 14 About how long was that from when shots Ο. fired to in the motorcade? 15 Two, three minutes. 16 Α. 17 So, you got into the motorcade and went Ο. with President Trump's detail? 18 19 Α. Yes. 20 Q. Okay. Can you just walk us through kind of your experience once you were in the motorcade. 21 22 Α. Yeah. Again, I was in the backseat of an 23 armored SUV. Special Agent was driving, 24 Special Agent was in the front passenger seat,

and we were the vehicle directly behind the

candidate, and we just provided security from the 1 2 rally site to Butler Memorial Hospital. What were your actions on the car ride? 3 4 Α. I just sat in the backseat and --5 Q. Were you talking on ops 4 at all, were you 6 arranging, or were you just letting ops --7 I -- I didn't make any communication until Α. 8 I got to Butler Memorial Hospital. 9 Okay. What did you communicate at that 0. 10 point? 11 Α. Once I was at Butler Memorial Hospital, I was directed by Special Agent and then a 12 13 Pennsylvania State Police -- one of the team 14 leaders, I don't know his name -- let me back up 15 here. 16 I had -- Special Agent told me that 17 -- he said -- he asked me to deploy the CAT team to 18 the hospital, and that was to support Pennsylvania 19 State Police in a perimeter, and they also -- the 20 helicopter pad, they needed security set up around 21 that too just as an additional option to evacuate. 22 Q. And so what CAT team arrived? It was the

CAT team one that was positioned behind the

Yes. CAT team one.

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Butler CAT team?

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1 stage --2 Α. Yes. -- during the rally? 3 Ο. 4 Α. Uh-huh. From the hospital, what were -- where did 5 Q. 6 you go? 7 From the hospital, we went to Pittsburgh Α. International Airport. 8 9 Okay. And at what point did you separate 10 from his detail? 11 Α. I have 23:09 hours. 12 0. So, was the stated intent to have you co-13 located there so you could kind of be the liaison 14 between Butler ESU and Secret Service in an event 15 like something like this happening? 16 It was exactly the reason I was positioned Α. 17 It was just to assist in communicating with them. with evacuating the candidate and his detail in 18 19 case there was an attack. It was -- it was 20 ironically the exact mission I was given. 21 And when was that mission, that exact 0. mission, communicated to you? 22 23 Initially, it was given to me by Commander 24 on the walk-through day briefly, and then it

was reinforced and made very, very clear to me that

that was my job whenever I was in the SUV with 1 2 and at 17:52 hours. That's when Special Agent was very 3 4 specific on what my job was if something was to 5 happen. Okay. Well, it's 6 7 almost my time, so we will go off the record. (Recess was taken.) 8 9 We can go back on the 10 record. 11 BY 12 Q. , I understand that during the 13 planning phase after the meeting on July 8th with 14 Secret Service, I understand that you reached out to Beaver County ESU for assistance; is that 15 16 accurate? 17 Α. Yes. Whom did you contact? 18 19 I talked with Commander 20 Assistant Commander 21 Did you reach out to any other tactical Q. 22 teams to request assistance following the meeting? 23 I did not. 24 What did you request of and 25 ?

- I just asked them for additional support 1 Α. 2 with operators. At that point, were the specific 3 4 responsibilities of those operators made clear? 5 Α. No. Was that informed by anything that Secret 6 7 Service specifically told you it needed or a general direction that they needed CAT teams? 8 Yeah, I didn't give them any specific 9 10 information. I just asked them specifically for
  - additional operators. That's all.
  - 0. Returning to the Secret Service, as best you can recall, did they give you anything along the lines of a manpower request for assets from Butler ESU?
    - Back -- let me back up. Α. No.

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Whenever I was asked to provide the CAT teams, they did say six to eight ESU members for each team. That was the only specific, I guess.

- In your experience, would something like a Q. manpower request from the Secret Service look like a process involving a sheet of paper with a list of assets, or is it that meeting where they tell you what they need?
  - From my experience, it was just a verbal Α.

request.

- Q. Now, onto the briefing that you mentioned on July 13. You mentioned after that briefing, you forced a team lead meeting?
  - A. Yes.
  - O. Who attended that?
- A. All the team leaders within the room. It was Butler ESU, Washington County, and Beaver ESU. All our team leaders.
- Q. Is it fair to say that was an orientation meeting for their responsibilities for the day?
- A. It was just a final meeting to -- to force each -- each -- each group to just let us know that they understood exactly what was asked of them, and if they had any additional questions, that was the time to ask it.

- Q. Going back to communications that day.

  Your responsibility with the Secret Service was to serve as a type of liaison between the Secret Service and Butler ESU; correct?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. Did you understand that liaison role to be with any other entities other than Butler ESU and Secret Service?

1 Α. No. 2 As your role as a liaison there between Secret Service and Butler ESU, were you 3 4 communicating information that the Secret Service 5 was providing you to Butler ESU? Α. 6 No. 7 Did you communicate on July 13th with Ο. Secret Service in any form of communication other 8 than through the use of a phone? 9 10 I received the two phone calls from Special Α. 11 Agent . That was it. 12 Q. Okay. Did you receive any text messages 13 from Special Agent ? 14 No text messages, no. 15 Did you receive any signal messages Q. between -- from Special Agent ? 16 17 Α. No. You mentioned your role as a liaison 18 Ο. Okay. 19 between Secret Service and Butler ESU. Were you aware of any other local law enforcement entities 20 21 that had a liaison-type role such as yourself with 22 the Secret Service? 23 Α. No. 24 In those calls with Special Agent , were Q.

you using your work phone or your personal phone?

A. Personal phone.

- Q. Can you describe the local command post for us. I understand that there were Butler ESU personnel in the local command post; is that accurate?
- A. The only description I could give you of the command post was after I returned that night.

  I was not in that command post once during the entire rally.
- Q. Did you have any contact with the Secret Service command post after you engaged with Secret Service when they arrived with the motorcade?
  - A. None.
- Q. Do you recall any communications on radio ops 4 that were discussing removing the candidate from the stage?
  - A. None.
- Q. At what point during the day of July 13th were you relieved of your duties for Butler ESU and your role as liaison for the Secret Service and Butler ESU?
  - A. I was released at 03:30 hours.
- Q. And after -- I understand that candidate -- Former President Trump, you know, he had left sometime before then. Did you return to the

campaign rally site after Former President Trump 1 2 departed from the airport? Yeah. I -- I departed the Pittsburgh 3 4 International Airport at 23:09 and I arrived back 5 at the rally site at approximately midnight. 6 Can you describe what happened at the time Q. 7 that you returned to the campaign rally site. Specifically, I -- I went to my work 8 9 vehicle. I -- I dropped off all my gear, 10 reorganized some of my gear, and then I -- I joined 11 Commander and Deputy Commander in the 12 command post. And that command post was the local command 13 14 post; correct? 15 For Butler, yes. Α. Were there any other individuals there at 16 Ο. that time? 17 18 Α. There were. There were people in and out. 19 Butler ESU members were getting interviewed by FBI, 20 State Police. There was a lot going on. It was 21 active. 22 Uh-huh. Do you recall anyone other than 23 local law enforcement that was at the local command 24 post during that time? Was anyone brought there

for questioning by the FBI or the Pennsylvania

State Police that wasn't a local law enforcement entity?

A. Not that I'm aware of.

Q. All right. After July 13, have you participated in any interviews with the FBI or

- A. I was interviewed briefly by two female agents shortly after I returned to the rally site. But it was just I -- it was very brief. It was just my name, who I was with, and my title, I believe. It was very, very quick.
- Q. After that interaction, you've had no further interviews with the FBI?
- A. No. I -- oh, I had an interview with the Pennsylvania State Police and the FBI at a later time.
  - Q. Any interviews with the Secret Service?
- A. None.

- Q. Can you describe Butler ESU's, you know, relationship with the Pennsylvania State Police during that day, the exchange of their roles and responsibilities.
- A. From my understanding is we had two separate assignments, two separate missions. Pennsylvania State Police, separate from the

And what he needed from me was to -- in the event that there was any type of an attack on the candidate, it was my responsibility to communicate through Butler ESU, coordinating with the Secret Service using a CAT team to evacuate the rally site and the candidate from the rally site.
- Q. Would you mind turning to Page 17 in Majority Exhibit 2. This is the command and control for the event on the 13th. Could you please just walk me through who these individuals are and exactly what their roles for that day were.
- A. All right. So -- okay. So you got the Butler Police OPS 4, that was our channel. Overall command was Lieutenant \_\_\_\_\_. That's Pennsylvania State Police.

- Q. What does that mean, "overall command"?
- A. Overall command is, the way I understand it, was that was Pennsylvania State Police, they had the majority of that jurisdiction of that Farm Show. So that the jurisdictional command went to the Pennsylvania State Police, and Lieutenant
- was designated as that -- that -- with that role and that responsibility.
- Q. Okay. So, by "overall command," it means jurisdictional -- they have jurisdiction over it.

  But with the day-to-day decisions, if the QRF needed to be deployed, if the CAT team was going to be deployed --
