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[REDACTED]: Today is Thursday,  
September 5, 2024, and this is a transcribed  
interview of Butler County Sheriff's Office Deputy  
[REDACTED].

House Resolution 1367 directed this Task  
Force to investigate the facts and circumstances of  
the attempted assassination of Donald J. Trump on  
July 13, 2024 in Butler, Pennsylvania.

Pursuant to House Resolution 1367,  
Chairman Kelly and Ranking Member Crow have  
requested this interview as part of the Task  
Force's investigation.

Q. Can the witness please state [REDACTED] name and  
spell [REDACTED] last name for the record.

A. Sure. [REDACTED]

Q. Thank you, [REDACTED]

My name is [REDACTED]. I'm the  
Deputy Staff Director for the Task Force, and I  
want to thank you for coming in today voluntarily.  
We appreciate that.

You're allowed to have an attorney  
present to advise you during this interview. Do  
you have an attorney representing you in your  
personal capacity today?

1 A. No, I don't.

2 Q. Thank you.

3 [REDACTED]: Next, starting with the  
4 Majority, then Minority, can the additional staff  
5 members please introduce themselves starting with  
6 their name, title and affiliation.

7 [REDACTED]: [REDACTED], Senior  
8 Professional Staff Member with the Task Force  
9 Majority.

10 [REDACTED]: [REDACTED], Senior  
11 Counsel, also with the Task Force Majority.

12 [REDACTED]: [REDACTED],  
13 Investigative Counsel with the Minority, and our  
14 staff director, [REDACTED], may be in and  
15 out.

19 [REDACTED]: Thanks, everyone.

20 [REDACTED]:

21 Q. [REDACTED], before we begin, we'll go over  
22 the ground rules for this interview.

23 A. Okay.

24 Q. The way this interview will proceed is the  
25 Majority and Minority Staff will alternate asking

1       you questions, 30 minutes per side, per round,  
2       until each side is finished with their questioning.

3               The Majority Staff will begin and  
4       proceed for 30 minutes, and then the Minority Staff  
5       will have 30 minutes to ask their questions.

6               We will then alternate back and forth in  
7       this manner until both sides have no more  
8       questions.

9               If either side is in the middle of a  
10       specific line of questions, they may choose to end  
11       a few minutes past an hour -- or 30 minutes -- to  
12       ensure completion of that specific line of  
13       questioning, to include any pertinent followups.

14              In this interview, while one member of  
15       the staff for each side may lead the questioning,  
16       additional staff may ask questions.

17              There's a court reporter taking down  
18       everything that I say and everything that you say  
19       to make a written record of the interview.

20              For the record to be clear, please wait  
21       until after the staffer questioning you have  
22       finished each question before you begin your  
23       answer, and the staffer will wait for you to finish  
24       your sentence before proceeding with the next  
25       question.

Further, to ensure the court reporter can properly record this interview, please speak clearly, concisely and slowly.

Also, the court reporter cannot record nonverbal answers, such as nodding or shaking your head. So it's important that you answer each question with an audible, verbal answer.

Do you understand?

A. I do.

Q. We want to take our time with these questions to make sure we have the most complete and accurate transcript.

So if we have questions that you do not fully understand, please let us know. We will attempt to clarify, add context to, or rephrase our questions?

Do you understand?

A. Yes.

Q. If we ask about specific conversations or events in the past and you are unable to recall the exact words or details, you should testify to the substance of those conversations or events to the best of your recollection.

If you recall only part of a conversation or event, you should give us your best

1 recollection of those events or parts of  
2 conversations that you do recall.

3 Do you understand?

4 A. I do.

5 Q. Although you are here voluntarily and we  
6 will not swear you in, you are required, pursuant  
7 to 18 U.S. Code § 1001, to answer questions from  
8 Congress truthfully. This also applies to  
9 questions posed by congressional staff during an  
10 interview.

11 Do you understand?

12 A. I do.

13 Q. If at any time you knowingly make false  
14 statements, you can be subject to criminal  
15 prosecution.

16 Do you understand?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. Is there any reason you are unable to  
19 provide truthful testimony in today's interview?

20 A. No.

21 Q. Please note that if you wish to assert a  
22 privilege over any statement today, the assertion  
23 must apply within the rules of the House of  
24 Representatives.

25 For the Chair to consider assertion of

1 privilege over testimony or statements, witnesses  
2 or entities must clearly state the specific  
3 privilege being asserted and the reason for the  
4 assertion on or before the scheduled day of the  
5 testimony or appearance.

6 Do you understand?

7 A. I do.

8 Q. Finally, I'd like to note that the content  
9 of what we discuss today is confidential. We ask  
10 that you do not speak about what we discuss here  
11 today in this interview to any individual outside,  
12 in order to preserve the integrity of this  
13 investigation.

14 For these same reasons, the marked  
15 exhibits today will be provided to the court  
16 reporter so they may go on to the official  
17 transcript, and any copies of those exhibits will  
18 be returned to us when we wrap.

19 We plan to take a five-minute break at  
20 the end of each 30 minutes of questioning, but if  
21 you need a longer break or a break before that,  
22 please let us know and we're happy to accommodate.

23 However, to the extent that there is a  
24 pending question, we would ask that you finish  
25 answering the question before we take the break.



1 Do you understand?

2 A. I do.

3 Q. Do you have any other questions before we  
4 begin?

5 A. No.

6 Q. The time is now 1:58, and the Majority  
7 staff will begin our questions.

8 How long have you worked for the Butler  
9 County Sheriff's Office?

10 A. I've worked here since March of 2019. So  
11 about five years, a little over five years.

12 Q. And how much of that was in your current  
13 role?

14 A. As a deputy?

15 Q. Mm-hmm.

16 A. The entire time.

17 Q. Oh, okay.

18 A. Yeah.

19 Q. What are your daily responsibilities in  
20 your current role?

21 A. Right now I'm on civil. So I just serve  
22 civil papers all day, basically.

23 Q. Got it. And did you have any other  
24 roles --

25 A. Yeah. Before I was on civil, I was

1 transporting inmates back and forth, whether it was  
2 to the hospital, jail to jail, you know, providing  
3 the courthouse security, things like that.

4 Q. When did you first learn that the former  
5 President Trump was coming to Butler, to the best  
6 of your recollection?

7 A. I don't remember the exact date, but it was  
8 a couple days. It was the week of. The beginning  
9 of that week.

10 Q. Do you remember how you learned of it?

11 A. I heard guys talking about it in the  
12 office, and then my chief actually came to me and  
13 asked me.

14 Q. What did he ask you?

15 A. If I would be willing to work it.

16 Q. Did he say like in what capacity or just  
17 like, "Are you available?"

18 A. No. He just said, "Are you available on  
19 that day to work?"

20 Q. Okay. So you said yes?

21 A. I obviously said yes, yep. Yep.

22 Q. So from the time you said yes, were there  
23 other meetings or things that occurred that week  
24 prior to the 13th?

25 A. No. So there was no meeting or anything

1       like that. He ended up getting ahold of me again  
2       saying -- there were a bunch of guys that he asked  
3       to do it, and when he said it was only going to be  
4       comp time instead of overtime, that changed a lot  
5       of people's mind.

6               So he wanted to make sure I was okay  
7       with just taking comp time instead of the overtime.  
8       Obviously, then, I said I'd still do it.

9               But other than that, there was no  
10      meeting or anything like that.

11       Q.     Okay. When you say "he," that's your --

12       A.     That's my chief. Sorry.

13       Q.     -- your chief. That's okay.

14       A.     Chief [REDACTED]

15       Q.     Just because I'm curious, what's the  
16      difference between comp time and overtime?

17       A.     So comp time is what you earn from doing  
18      extra details like that. It basically gives you  
19      another day off.

20       Q.     Okay. So it's like an exchange?

21       A.     Yeah. So instead of taking the overtime  
22      for money, you work the overtime detail for comp  
23      time to have another day off.

24       Q.     Got it.

25       A.     If that makes sense?

1 Q. Yes. That does make sense.

2 A. Okay.

3 Q. So there were no meetings leading up to it.

4 Did you ever talk to anyone from Secret  
5 Service leading up to it?

6 A. No.

7 Q. Did you talk to anyone from other -- Butler  
8 County ESU? Beaver County ESU?

9 A. Nobody.

10 Q. Nobody?

11 A. Nope.

12 Q. Literally no one. Got it.

13 A. Nope. Just the chief. That was it.

14 Q. Okay. So did you have a meeting day of?

15 A. No, we did not.

16 Q. How did you know where to show up?

17 A. So I can't -- like I said, I don't have my  
18 notes in front of me.

19 Q. That's okay.

20 A. So I don't recall the exact day. But I  
21 think it was that Friday, that Thursday or that  
22 Friday, when my chief called me and asked me if I  
23 was okay with taking the comp time for it.

24 He said he was going to be e-mailing me  
25 over a list of everybody that was working it and

1 their post and a picture of where my post was, kind  
2 of, you know, where everybody's was.

3 So that's how I knew where I was that  
4 day.

5 Q. Okay. We will introduce -- we're going to  
6 mark this as Majority Exhibit 1. This is a map  
7 that the Majority received from --

8 [REDACTED]: Pennsylvania State Police.  
9 (Majority Exhibit No. 1 was marked for  
10 identification.)

11 Q. Is this the map you were given that day?

12 A. This is, yep.

13 Q. This is? Okay.

14 And can you tell us where you are on  
15 these dots?

16 A. So I was No. 4.

17 Q. You were No. 4?

18 A. I was Post 4, yes.

19 Q. So when you got this map, did you respond  
20 in any way, or you were just like, "This is my  
21 assignment. I'm just going to go do it"?

22 A. No. Yeah, that's pretty much it. I never  
23 responded. I looked at it, and I kind of figured  
24 I'd know my way there.

25 Q. Okay, fair. Had you been to the

1 fairgrounds?

2 A. Farm grounds.

3 Q. Farm grounds?

4 A. I had never been there before. Never. I  
5 drive past it all the time, obviously, but I've  
6 never been at the farm grounds before, other than  
7 this was my first time on that date.

8 Q. Do you remember what time you reported to  
9 your post?

10 A. 10:45, roughly.

11 Q. Was that something they told you to do?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. And when you got to your post, what  
14 happened?

15 A. So like I said, I've never actually been to  
16 the Farm Show grounds before. So I had the guy at  
17 Post 6, another deputy, he showed me exactly where  
18 I needed to be.

19 And so after he showed me where I needed  
20 to be, I sat there and I waited for the trooper to  
21 come next to me and kind of just watched the  
22 fenced-in area there.

23 Q. Okay. Had the other deputy been there  
24 before or how did he know?

25 A. Yes. Yes.

1           Q.    In the e-mail, had this map -- was there  
2 anything else attached to the e-mail?

3           A.    No.   Just this map and then the rest of the  
4 list of people and where they were with their phone  
5 numbers and names.

6           Q.    Okay.   Other than the deputy who was  
7 positioned at 6, did you talk with other officials  
8 in the area?

9           A.    I had talked to the trooper at Post 5.

10          Q.    Trooper at Post 5.   Where was he from?

11          A.    PSP.

12          Q.    PSP?

13          A.    Yeah.

14          Q.    Okay.   Was he able to provide any guidance  
15 on what you should be doing other than standing  
16 there, watching?

17          A.    No.   We kind of -- we talked about, you  
18 know, what we were -- we both already knew what we  
19 were doing but we just kind of -- we weren't real  
20 close to each other where we could talk through the  
21 window, but I mean the area was so big there, you  
22 could see if anybody was going to jump the fence or  
23 anything.

24                        So once in a while, we'd go up to each  
25 other because we don't have any way of

1 communication with each other, other than our  
2 cellphones.

3 Q. Okay.

4 A. And I could get a cellphone number from  
5 this (indicating), but I just kind of went over  
6 there and we talked and just kind of said, you  
7 know, if we need each other, kind of holler.

8 Q. Okay. So I'm going to go through a couple  
9 things you just said.

10 You said you talked through the window,  
11 so you were in your car at this post?

12 A. We were both in our car. We couldn't talk  
13 through the window like this (indicating). We'd  
14 have to drive up to each other. But we weren't --  
15 if you look at the map here, we really weren't that  
16 far from each other, you know. So I wasn't like  
17 going way out of my way.

18 Q. Okay. For the communications, you said you  
19 could get his cellphone number "from here."

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. Did you ever communicate with him via his  
22 cellphone?

23 A. I never did, no.

24 Q. What about your deputy on Post 6?

25 Did you have communication via cellphone



1 with them?

2 A. Almost the entire time. We called multiple  
3 times. We texted back and forth until the phone  
4 stopped working. But other than that...

5 Q. Okay. Is that like a work phone you guys  
6 are given or --

7 A. No.

8 Q. It's personal phones?

9 A. Yeah. They're personal.

10 Q. This might seem dumb and not relevant --

11 A. You're fine.

12 Q. -- but was it Verizon, AT&T, T-Mobile?

13 A. Verizon.

14 Q. Verizon, okay.

15 A. Yes, Verizon.

16 Q. Do you have their FrontLine? It's like for  
17 first responders?

18 A. No, I don't. Nope.

19 Q. Okay. So you get to your post around  
20 10:45. Talk with the deputy. Talk with the PSP  
21 officer.

22 Which direction did you decide that your  
23 car was going to be facing or you would be looking?

24 A. So we were all facing -- I mean 3 - 4.

25 Kind of not really 3 because he was kind of

1 diagonal. But 4, 5 and 6, we were all facing the  
2 AGR building. So the crowd was behind us.

3 Q. Okay. What time did people start coming up  
4 to that fence on the AGR side, if you can remember?

5 A. I don't even -- I don't know the exact  
6 time. I think it was somewhere maybe around like  
7 2. You'd have a couple people, like, floating back  
8 and forth, but more people started to come there.

9 It was about 4:15, 4:30, something like  
10 that, is when the bigger crowds started to come.

11 Q. Okay. Not to backtrack, but did you guys  
12 all have a conversation? Say, "Hey, we're all  
13 going to face the AGR building"? Or how did you  
14 decide to face that way?

15 A. That's how we were told. When I went to my  
16 post, the chief actually came around and, you know,  
17 we were all already facing that way because that  
18 was kind of -- my role there was to make sure  
19 nobody was gonna hop the fence, basically.

20 So I knew I had to face that area, but  
21 other than that, I mean, that's it.

22 Q. Do you remember what time the chief came  
23 around?

24 A. He came around multiple times, just, you  
25 know, if we needed breaks and stuff like that. So

1 he probably came around four or five times.

2 Q. And in any of those discussions, did he  
3 bring up anything abnormal or he was just, like,  
4 checking in?

5 A. No. He was just checking in.

6 Q. Did he talk to you about Secret Service or  
7 what they were doing?

8 A. No.

9 Q. Other than PSP and, obviously, your  
10 colleague, did you talk to any other law  
11 enforcement agencies there?

12 A. No, I did not.

13 Q. Were you aware that Butler ESU was going to  
14 have snipers in the AGR building?

15 A. No. No. No.

16 Q. Did you become aware of that during the  
17 day?

18 A. No. I actually thought because I called --  
19 like I said, the deputy at Post 6 and I, we were  
20 back and forth all day, and I actually called him  
21 and I said, "I don't see anybody on the AGR  
22 building. Don't you think somebody is going to be  
23 up there?"

24 And he said, "Oh, yeah, yeah. PSP has  
25 that covered." He's retired from the state police.

1       So that's why he said that.

2                   And I'm like, "Okay." I'm like,  
3       "Because that's kind of a big, open area there.  
4       Like somebody needs to be over there." And I  
5       didn't know that anybody was even inside the  
6       building.

7                   And he's like, "Oh, yeah, yeah. No  
8       worries." I'm like, "Okay. Okay."

9       Q.    It seemed like a vulnerability, from your  
10      perspective?

11      A.    Yeah. I mean, I knew that was an issue  
12      over there, but I didn't know anybody was in the  
13      building. I did not.

14      Q.    Okay. And so he said that PSP had that  
15      covered?

16      A.    He -- he --

17      Q.    He thought?

18      A.    He thought because he worked for PSP  
19      before. He retired from there. He's like, "Oh,  
20      yeah. Don't worry. They'll have guys all over  
21      that." That's what he told me.

22                   Because that's my main thing was I'm  
23      watching this fence line.

24      Q.    Right.

25      A.    But the AGR building's right there, and I

1 don't see any other law enforcement around there.

2 So... And he's like, "Oh, yeah. Don't worry." And  
3 I'm like, "Okay."

4 You know, I don't know. That's just --  
5 that's stuff that I think about.

6 Q. Of course, because you've been doing this  
7 for a couple of years.

8 A. Yeah. Yeah.

9 Q. So there was no other law enforcement  
10 around. There were no cars.

11 Was anyone in that parking lot of AGR  
12 that you saw?

13 A. I couldn't see like a parking lot or  
14 anything like that.

15 Q. Oh.

16 A. But there was just, you know, a bunch of  
17 people that were coming and going, and then  
18 eventually some people brought up chairs, and  
19 that's when it got pretty busy there.

20 Q. Okay.

21 A. But no cars.

22 Q. So were there any other maps or handouts  
23 given to you to prep for this?

24 A. No. This was it.

25 Q. This was it? Okay.

1                   You said you could not communicate with  
2                   the PSP individual except for by cellphone; right?

3           A.     That's correct, unless I went up to him,  
4           yeah.

5           Q.     Oh, sure.

6           A.     Our radios --

7           Q.     Radios do not talk?

8           A.     No.

9           Q.     Do you know what channel you were on or,  
10           like your sheriff's office is on?

11          A.     I was -- that's something that we talked  
12           about when I first got there. I called Sergeant  
13           [REDACTED] and I said, "Where are we? What do you want  
14           us on?" He said, "On the sheriff's channel."

15          Q.     Okay.

16          A.     Well, I scan, as well, so that way I can  
17           hear, you know, the township and, you know, anybody  
18           else in case there was anything going on.

19                   So I was on the sheriff channel, but I  
20           was scanning, at the same time, them.

21                   - - - - -

22   BY [REDACTED]:

23          Q.     Question: When you were scanning, could  
24           you hear state police?

25          A.     No. So the state police, they have their

1 own radio. They can't hear us; we can't hear them.

2 Q. No interoperability?

3 A. Yeah.

4 BY [REDACTED]:

5 Q. Who else is on that channel or, I guess, on  
6 the scanning?

7 Who would you pick up?

8 A. I would pick up everybody in Butler County.  
9 All you -- I mean, everybody down from Cranberry  
10 all the way up to Slippery Rock.

11 Q. Okay. So that could be like the emergency  
12 line?

13 A. It would be any police line.

14 Q. Any police line?

15 A. Yeah. Any police like that. Like, really,  
16 I know what the city and the township are. They're  
17 1400 and 1300.

18 So that's what I was really trying to  
19 listen to because we were in that area. So if  
20 there was something going on, I would know.

21 Q. Did anyone instruct you that if you needed  
22 to flag something for Secret Service or PSP how to  
23 do that?

24 A. What we were told was call it through the  
25 sheriff channel, who then Sergeant [REDACTED], who was in

the command post, would let the correct people know. That's what we were told.

Q. As far as you know, Sergeant [REDACTED] was in the local trailer command post?

A. I guess so. I'm not 100 percent sure where he was. All he said was the command post. I guess. That's all I know.

Q. That's okay.

Did anyone tell you how you would hear if Secret Service or PSP had an update that needed to be shared?

A. No. Other than if he, meaning Sergeant [REDACTED], knew anything, he would relay the information to us.

Q. Did you get any information from Secret Service about watching for drones in the area?

A. No. No.

Q. Were you aware that Secret Service had a drone they might fly?

A. No.

Q. If you had seen a drone that you were not anticipating, what would that protocol -- like what would the reaction be to that?

A. I would have called it in to the sheriff's channel to Sergeant [REDACTED] at the command post.



1 Q. And from your time there at 10:45 until you  
2 departed, did you see a drone?

3 A. I did not.

4 Q. What time did you depart from the scene?

5 A. It was approximately like 9 p.m. maybe.

6 Q. I'm trying to go as much in timeline order  
7 as possible.

8 So around 4:15, 4:30, you start noticing  
9 more individuals coming up on the fence. Is that  
10 something you would call in? Just we have a crowd,  
11 something we're monitoring, or is that just sort of  
12 you're just going to monitor it first?

13 A. Well, I kind of watched the area there,  
14 until at one point I was waved down by an  
15 individual across the gate or the fence there.

16 Q. Okay. So tell me about that.

17 A. There was a guy. He kind of like went like  
18 this (demonstrating). Well, I looked at the  
19 trooper next to me. I don't know what he was  
20 doing. So I just drove up there.

21 And there were two males. They were in  
22 an argument. The one said he was the owner of the  
23 AGR building and he wanted all the people off the  
24 property, and he was mad that everybody was there,  
25 said they shouldn't be there. And, personally, I

1 didn't think anybody should have been over there,  
2 anyway. That's just my personal opinion.

3 But I told him, you know, "Hang tight."  
4 I went and got the trooper. We walked over there  
5 and basically told everybody to leave the area.

6 Well, that only happened for so long,  
7 until five minutes later there's a bunch of new  
8 people that come up.

9 Other than that, that was the only time  
10 that I went up there for that.

11 Q. And that was someone on the AGR side of the  
12 fence?

13 A. Yeah. They were across the fence, yeah,  
14 not in the inner fence where I was.

15 Q. Did you understand your position to be the  
16 outer perimeter of the event?

17 A. Yeah.

18 Q. Were you told that, or did you just figure  
19 that out from the map?

20 A. No. I just figured it out from the map.

21 Q. What time was that initial conversation  
22 with the owner of the AGR wanting people to leave,  
23 to the best of your recollection?

24 A. Maybe around -- maybe around 5, somewhere  
25 around there.

1 Q. How often were you in communication via  
2 text with Sergeant [REDACTED]?

3 A. There was a group message with everybody  
4 that was there.

5 Q. Everybody from the sheriff's office that  
6 was there?

7 A. Yeah. Everybody that was there, yeah.

8 So I don't know. Not much. We talk  
9 more on the radio than anything, but I don't know.

10 Q. A few?

11 A. Yeah. Just a couple, yeah. Not really  
12 much. Like I said, it was all mainly on the radio  
13 we were talking.

14 Q. Do you remember if he texted you anything  
15 of consequence, anything that you thought was  
16 interesting or, like, you needed to look out for?

17 A. He said on the radio to be on the lookout  
18 for an individual.

19 Q. Okay.

20 A. And that, obviously, I was looking for.

21 Q. Sure. So our understanding is that he was  
22 trying to text you pictures of a suspicious person  
23 maybe on that chain.

24 A. Yes. So he was trying to -- he told us on  
25 the radio he was trying to send us pictures,

1       whether it was to myself or whether it was to the  
2       group, but the phones weren't working. I mean, my  
3       phone wasn't even working then.

4           Q.     Do you remember what time that was about?

5           A.     That he sent the picture?

6           Q.     Radioed saying, "Hey, I'm trying to get  
7       this" --

8           A.     Oh, I remember exactly.

9           Q.     Okay. Tell us.

10          A.     It was 5:15 p.m. I remember because the  
11       trooper was -- his phone wasn't working either, and  
12       he actually needed to use my phone. I turned it  
13       off and turned it on multiple times.

14                   I got service for like 30 seconds, but  
15       he used my phone to call his -- I don't know what  
16       he is -- lieutenant, corporal. I don't know what  
17       he is. Somebody.

18          Q.     So he used your phone to call somebody on  
19       his side?

20          A.     Because his phone wasn't working either.  
21       And it was about the people that were along the  
22       fence line because, obviously, we knew nobody  
23       should be over there.

24                   So we wanted somebody to go get the  
25       people out of there.

1 Q. Do something about that?

2 A. Yeah. And that was at 5:15.

3 Q. That's at 5:15. Can you just sort of walk  
4 me through what happened next?

5 A. So after we went there and told everybody  
6 to leave, more people came. We went back to our  
7 cars. He's trying to use his phone. The phones  
8 aren't working. My phone wasn't working either.

9 I don't know if it was because all the  
10 people were there, but nobody's phone was really  
11 working, you know: Sergeant [REDACTED]; the deputy at  
12 Post 6.

13 So he asked me if he could use my phone.  
14 I'm like, "Yeah. Let me turn it off and turn it  
15 back on." I did that. It finally worked.

16 I said, "Here. Hurry up. Use it as you  
17 can before it stops," and he did. He was in his  
18 car, and he had the window up because it was so  
19 loud.

20 I don't know the conversation that they  
21 had, but it was basically about the people over  
22 there. He wanted PSP to send somebody over to  
23 clear them out, and he gave me back my phone and I  
24 went back to my post and that was it.

25 Q. Did he say why he wasn't radioing it back

1 in?

2 A. He did not tell me. I didn't even ask  
3 questions. I have no idea why he didn't radio it.

4 Q. That's completely fair. You saw a need and  
5 you fixed it?

6 A. Yeah.

7 Q. Do you remember the first time you became  
8 aware of the person, of the suspicious person?

9 A. It was somewhere maybe around like 5:40,  
10 5:45 maybe is when Sergeant [REDACTED] was on the radio  
11 telling us and he was attempting to send a picture  
12 to us. It was somewhere around that time.

13 Q. Okay. I think we heard that he was maybe  
14 going to e-mail them to you or try to e-mail them?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. Did you get that e-mail?

17 A. So I did get the e-mail, but the e-mail,  
18 the time that it says that I got it, I didn't  
19 actually. Like nothing would load.

20 Do you know what I mean?

21 Q. Right, yes.

22 A. So I may have actually got it at that time,  
23 but nothing was loading then. And, honestly, I  
24 didn't even see the picture until minutes before  
25 the shots were fired. Like maybe two minutes,

three minutes.

- - - - -

BY [REDACTED]:

Q. Was that the first time that you heard anything about a suspicious person?

Was there anything earlier in the day about a different --

A. No. So just about that 5:40, 5:45 time is when I knew about a suspicious person.

- - - - -

BY [REDACTED]:

Q. Did he say anything about where that person was?

A. He said he was last seen at the AGR building, around the AGR building.

Q. So tell us what happens.

You get this call. What do you do next?

A. So, yeah. So I'm kind of looking. I'm on the phone with the deputy at Post 6 and, you know, "Hey, did you hear that radio? You know, do you see this guy? If you do, let me know, obviously. Call it in."

He didn't see anything. I didn't see anything either. And I mean that was pretty much it, other than going back and forth on the radio

1 with him saying what I see because he said it was a  
2 male on a bicycle, backpack.

3 I said, "I see a male on a bicycle with  
4 short hair." He's like, "No. It's long hair."  
5 I'm like, "Okay. That's not the guy then."

6 So I couldn't see anybody else that  
7 matched the description. So...

8 Q. And the "he" in this circumstance was...?

9 A. Was the individual suspect.

10 Q. Oh, no. The "he" you were talking to.  
11 Sorry.

12 You said, "He said it was a suspect with  
13 a bicycle and a backpack."

14 A. Oh. Sergeant [REDACTED].

15 Q. Sergeant [REDACTED]?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. On the radio?

18 A. Yes. On the radio, yep.

19 Q. And then you mentioned you had called the  
20 PSP officer?

21 A. No, no, no. This was the deputy at Post 6.

22 Q. The deputy at Post 6?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. Okay. So you guys were on the same radio  
25 communication?



1 A. Yeah. I, actually, was on my phone then.

2 Q. Okay. So the phones were working at 5:45.

3 A. So it was hit or miss there. I had to turn  
4 it off, turn it on; turn it off, turn it on, yeah.

5 Q. So he receives a call. You talk back and  
6 forth: "We're looking for this guy. Do you see  
7 him?" type conversation?

8 A. Yeah.

9 Q. And he was the one that said, "This may be  
10 a person with a bicycle"?

11 A. On a bicycle with a backpack, long hair.

12 Q. Was that --

13 A. And I think he said white shirt. I can't  
14 remember the exact color shirt, but, yeah.

15 Q. Was that something he had seen, the  
16 suspicious person, or someone told him that that's  
17 what he was looking for?

18 A. That's the picture that Sergeant [REDACTED] was  
19 attempting to send to us.

20 Q. Okay.

21 A. And since I couldn't get it to my phone, he  
22 was explaining --

23 Q. Oh.

24 A. -- what he was wearing and apparently what  
25 he was riding.

1 Q. Okay. So he was able to get the pictures?

2 A. Yeah. Sergeant [REDACTED] had it. He was trying  
3 to send them, but his phone wasn't really working  
4 either.

5 Q. So then he's radioing the description?

6 A. Yes. That's exactly it.

7 Q. Okay. That makes sense.

8 Did you communicate that with the  
9 Pennsylvania State Police person next to you?

10 A. So when I finally got the picture, I  
11 actually had my car. Like I said, I probably got  
12 it two, three minutes before shots were actually  
13 fired.

14 I was kind of looking. There were a lot  
15 of people on the fence line. A lot. So I'm kind  
16 of looking, trying to see if I see anybody that  
17 matches that description.

18 I put the car in drive to go show the  
19 trooper, "This is a picture that I got. Did you  
20 get this picture?"

21 Well, as I was in drive, I was almost to  
22 him and the shots were already fired. So I never  
23 even got to show him the picture.

24 Q. Okay. So let's talk about the shots being  
25 fired. You're literally physically driving?

1           A.     I'm actually in drive, yes.

2           Q.     So tell us what happens.  You hear the  
3     shots.

4           A.     So I hear the shots.  I already have my  
5     window cracked, so I know there's shots.  And I  
6     could hear the radio traffic when I was scanning.  
7     So I knew they were looking for somebody over  
8     there.

9                     I had it in drive.  I obviously ended up  
10    putting it in park and I get out.  I mean, I just  
11    opened up my door, pull out my gun, and I just --

12          Q.     Waited?

13          A.     Yeah.  Pretty much.

14          Q.     So you open up your door.  Pull out your  
15    gun.  Are you behind the car at this point?

16          A.     Yeah.  I have the door open.  I'm kind of  
17    taking cover behind the driver's side door.

18          Q.     Could you tell where the shots came from?

19          A.     Yeah.  From over at the AGR building.  I  
20    couldn't tell exactly where, but I could tell they  
21    were from over there, yes.

22          Q.     Did you see Crooks, who we now know as  
23    Crooks, did you see him on the roof before shots  
24    were fired?

25          A.     I did not.

1 Q. Okay. Did you see him at any point in the  
2 time that you were looking for him?

3 A. I did not.

4 Q. Did you see him after shots were fired?

5 A. No.

6 - - - - -

7 BY [REDACTED]:

8 Q. Did you see any local law enforcement shoot  
9 towards the AGR roof after you heard the shots?

10 A. I did not see anybody shoot towards, no. I  
11 just seen local law enforcement running around the  
12 AGR building.

13 - - - - -

14 BY [REDACTED]:

15 Q. Okay. Were there some from your team?

16 A. No. It was the township, Butler Township.

17 Q. Where did they come from? Did you see?

18 A. Butler Township?

19 Q. Yeah.

20 A. They were actually right in front of me --  
21 obviously, a group of people -- but they were  
22 behind there. They were going to the back. I  
23 could see them running back and forth.

24 I could see them running back and forth  
25 alongside the AGR building, but they were right in

1 front of me. I could see them.

2 Q. Okay. Do you remember, when you first saw  
3 them come over -- this was before shots were  
4 fired -- if they're looking for the person?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. So they're walking around looking?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. How long were they looking for?

9 A. Not very long. I mean, what seems like 2  
10 minutes is 30 seconds, you know.

11 Q. Right.

12 A. So I don't really -- I don't really know  
13 exactly. But I can tell there's a difference from  
14 walking and looking and actually --

15 Q. Responding?

16 A. -- you know, you see something. You're  
17 kind of hustling to get there. That's what I seen.  
18 I seen somebody, which was the township, kind of  
19 running.

20 Q. Which makes sense.

21 A. Yeah.

22 Q. Did you hear anything on their radio  
23 channels?

24 A. I did.

25 Q. Okay. Can you talk us through that?

1           A.    I don't know exactly. Like I said, I was  
2 scanning. So I don't know if it was Police OPS 3  
3 or Police OPS 4, but it was one of them.

4                   I heard somebody from -- I believe it  
5 was the township -- basically saying, "He's on the  
6 roof." And then I heard them say, "Long gun."

7                   And like I said earlier, we were  
8 directed to only call out on the sheriff channel.  
9 So I figured a lot of the deputies were only  
10 listening to the sheriff channel.

11          Q.    Yeah.

12          A.    I always scan. So... And, actually,  
13 talking to the other deputies, they weren't  
14 scanning.

15                  So once I heard that information -- and  
16 like I said, I could see Butler Township running  
17 around -- obviously I knew somebody laid eyes on  
18 him.

19                  So I called that information out on the  
20 sheriff's channel that he had a long gun to let my  
21 guys know that.

22          Q.    Okay. Do you remember how long before  
23 shots were fired after you said --

24          A.    Oh, my gosh. Seconds.

25          Q.    Seconds?

1           A.     Seconds. And then the deputy at Post 6,  
2 right after I got off, because then I was going to  
3 say, "Shots fired."

4           Q.     Right.

5           A.     The deputy at Post 6 already was on the  
6 radio saying, "Shots fired."

7           Q.     "Shots fired."

8                     You get out of the car?

9           A.     Yep.

10          Q.     Standing. You're watching all this unfold.  
11 Do you remember anything else about those minutes,  
12 I guess, in between shots being fired and the end  
13 of shots fired?

14                     There were eight shots fired, as far as  
15 we understand.

16          A.     Yeah. I mean, it was quick. It was like  
17 that (clicks fingers.)

18                     After that, obviously no more shots were  
19 being fired and I helped the ESU team, you know,  
20 because they were behind the fence. They couldn't  
21 get over unless they jumped. Some of them did and  
22 cut themselves up. So...

23          Q.     Oh.

24          A.     They had to kind of run the PSP cruiser in,  
25 and I helped them get out. That's all I did.

1 I didn't go over to the other side of  
2 the fence where the AGR building is or anything  
3 like that.

4 Q. Helped them just get over the fence?

5 A. Under it.

6 Q. Under the fence?

7 A. Yeah. Well, he kind of rammed the PSP car  
8 into it. It made a little gap there. It was  
9 all -- it was locked so you couldn't open it. But  
10 other than that, that was it.

11 Q. Okay. Now, you said you were there -- I'm  
12 like right about time. I'm just going to finish my  
13 portion of this.

14 You were there until about 9?

15 A. At that spot until 9, yes. And then I went  
16 down and directed traffic until about 10.

17 Q. So what were you doing between shots being  
18 fired and 9:00? Just watching, guarding?

19 A. Yeah, I was watching. Sergeant [REDACTED] wanted  
20 me to go to the medical tent, make sure nobody was  
21 coming or leaving. That was roughly maybe 7:30.

22 I probably stayed there until about 8:00  
23 or so, and then I went back to my post. And then I  
24 called my chief and said, "Do you still want me  
25 here or where do you want me?" And then he said,



1 "Go to Butler Township, to the Butler Township guy  
2 on Whitestown Road," and see where I'm needed.

3 Q. Okay.

4 A. So then I went to him, and that's when I  
5 started directing traffic, which was like 9  
6 something.

7 Q. Was there a lot of chaos trying to get  
8 everybody out?

9 Is that where the traffic was?

10 A. So because they had all these roads blocked  
11 and they were only letting people go out some ways,  
12 they had us go down there. Blocked the one and let  
13 only people come down, yeah.

14 I don't know why they did it, but that's  
15 what they needed help with. They needed manpower  
16 down there.

17 Q. And my final question is that day who did  
18 you think was in charge of that scene?

19 A. Where I was?

20 Q. The entire existence.

21 Who do you think -- you know, as far as  
22 chain of command goes, you know, obviously you  
23 report to your chief, but...

24 A. I thought the Secret Service was in charge  
25 of it all.

1 Q. Right. Do you remember any reason why you  
2 thought that, or is it just that's how --

3 A. Well, I worked the last Trump thing and  
4 they were. I actually had somebody with me from  
5 the Secret Service. So...

6 Q. We'll definitely dive into that in our next  
7 set. So we can go off the record.

8 (Off the record.)

9 - - - - -

10 BY [REDACTED]:

11 Q. Deputy, again, my name is [REDACTED].  
12 I'm with the Minority staff. We have  
13 [REDACTED] walking in.

14 As we just talked about, this is  
15 bipartisan. We have kind of very similar  
16 questions. So sometimes I'm going to jump around a  
17 little bit because I mainly understood where they  
18 were coming from. I don't want to go back.

19 There are other times where I may repeat  
20 things just to make it clear for anyone reading it  
21 what I'm talking about, even though it be will be  
22 obvious to all of us.

23 Also, you seem pretty comfortable here,  
24 but I want to make it clear we don't have any  
25 implication in any question we're asking. We're

1 just trying to understand it. We're not trying to  
2 gauge anything.

3 So if anything doesn't make sense or I'm  
4 full of it and you need to correct me, please feel  
5 free to do so. Again, we're trying to understand  
6 what happened and make sure it doesn't happen  
7 again.

8 A. Yep.

9 Q. Sound fair? All right.

10 A background that got through this. I  
11 want to clarify: When you say "chief," you're not  
12 talking about Sheriff [REDACTED]; right?

13 A. No, I am not talking about the sheriff.  
14 I'm talking about our chief deputy.

15 Q. And that's [REDACTED]?

16 A. Chief [REDACTED], yep.

17 Q. Got it. Is he sort of the -- he's  
18 basically the lead nonelected official with you  
19 guys -- is that fair -- or what's his role?

20 A. Yeah. So the sheriff can kind of appoint  
21 his own chief, and that's who he appointed was  
22 Chief [REDACTED].

23 Q. And is he sort of, on day-to-day purposes,  
24 your boss?

25 A. The chief?

1 Q. Yeah.

2 A. Yeah.

3 Q. Where was he in the rally?

4 Was he at 6, or was he somewhere else?

5 A. No. My chief didn't actually have a post.

6 He was kind of a floater --

7 Q. Got it.

8 A. -- to see if, you know, guys needed breaks  
9 and things like that.

10 Q. Understood. Who was at 6, then?

11 A. That was Deputy [REDACTED].

12 Q. [REDACTED]. I was going to ask: [REDACTED]

13 [REDACTED]

14 A. [REDACTED].

15 Q. [REDACTED], okay. So you guys were both  
16 there that day?

17 A. We were.

18 Q. All right. How far away -- I'm looking at  
19 the Exhibit 1 from the Majority -- how far away --  
20 you know, I look at this -- how far away is 6 from  
21 where you were?

22 A. I had a feeling you were going to ask me  
23 that. I really don't -- I can't even -- maybe half  
24 a football length.

25 I mean, we really weren't all that far

1 from each other. I could see him.

2 Q. Now, at 6, you're more looking sort of the  
3 northwestern edge of that perimeter; is that right?

4 A. Yeah. We were kind of both faced almost  
5 the same way. He wasn't tilted more than me.

6 Q. I also want to orient you, or orient myself  
7 really, to this fairground or farm ground. So I'm  
8 giving you right now what has been premarked and  
9 given to the reporter as Minority Exhibit 1 -- or  
10 Alpha -- I'm sorry -- which is -- well, why don't  
11 you tell me what this is, generally speaking.

12 (Minority Exhibit A was marked for  
13 identification.)

14 A. So this is obviously the Farm Show grounds  
15 with the inner fence right there where I was and  
16 the AGR building on the other side.

17 Q. And this is looking northerly?

18 Is north the correct direction that this  
19 is looking, from your perception?

20 A. Yeah.

21 Q. Do you mind, with a number, just so I  
22 understand, can you just mark on that? And maybe  
23 we should use the official document for this.

24 Can you mark with a 4 where you were?

25 A. Yeah (indicating).

1 All right. If you can see that.

2 Q. Okay. And I'm going to have you do one  
3 more. Just a 5 where the PSP trooper was. And,  
4 you know, obviously this will be in the record. It  
5 will reflect they're relatively near the  
6 fairgrounds. So to the west or left of the AGR  
7 building.

8 A. (Indicating). Sorry. It's hard to see.

9 Q. I really appreciate that.

10 So looking at that then -- and I'll give  
11 this back to the reporter -- the PSP trooper, is  
12 that [REDACTED]?

13 A. Correct.

14 Q. Okay. And a recap. The deputy at 6 was  
15 [REDACTED]. You at 4. Then 5.

16 About, again, estimating, you said you  
17 were not super far apart but far enough where you  
18 couldn't speak to each other; is that right?

19 A. The trooper and I?

20 Q. Yes.

21 A. Yes. Yes, that's correct.

22 Q. Remind me. When did you call your chief  
23 about the AGR being somewhat uncovered?

24 A. I didn't call the chief.

25 Q. Okay. You called the deputy?

1 Tell me what happened when you first  
2 kind of were aware of AGR.

3 A. Oh. That was towards the beginning.

4 Q. Yeah, right.

5 A. Like I said, we kind of got there at like  
6 10:45. So I don't remember the exact time, but we  
7 were in touch most of the day.

8 I called him and I just said, you know,  
9 "Is anybody over there?" Just because I was  
10 wondering. I didn't call the chief. I didn't call  
11 the command post or anybody like that. It was just  
12 kind of, obviously, because I'm [REDACTED].

13 Q. That was to [REDACTED].

14 A. And I knew he was, you know, with PSP  
15 before and they've done stuff like this. So that's  
16 what I was wondering.

17 Q. And that's where I misunderstood.

18 So when you called about AGR, you called  
19 Deputy [REDACTED]?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. And he said -- who said then that PSP had  
22 it covered?

23 A. He didn't say, like, for sure that they  
24 did. He said, "Oh, I'm sure the state police has  
25 that covered over there."

1                   Because I said, "I don't see anybody."  
2       He said, "Oh, I'm sure they have it covered." He  
3       wasn't saying like they definitely do or anything  
4       like that.

5           Q.     So he was just presuming they have it  
6       covered --

7           A.     Yes.

8           Q.     -- because it was outside?

9           A.     Yes.

10          Q.     And you never knew anyone was inside AGR?

11          A.     Not until after.

12          Q.     Does that -- you know, I don't want you to  
13       speculate unnecessarily here, but if you had seen,  
14       let's say, a sniper with a long gun inside a  
15       building, would that have raised your hackles?

16                   Would you have called that in?

17          A.     I probably would have called it in on the  
18       sheriff's channel to, obviously, Sergeant [REDACTED] and  
19       asked him, which I'm assuming he probably knew.

20          Q.     Would that have been -- I mean, I guess I'm  
21       trying to understand. Did you think no one was in  
22       the building, or you just didn't have an idea?

23          A.     I had no idea anybody was over there. So  
24       if I seen any sort of activity inside the building,  
25       if I would have seen anything like that, anybody in



1       there with a long gun or even on top of the  
2       building, I would have definitely called it in just  
3       so somebody could clarify, "Yeah, we have guys over  
4       there."

5           Q.     At what point would it have escalated to  
6       more than calling it in for you; i.e., you see  
7       someone in the room with a gun that you don't know  
8       is there.

9                   I mean, at what point are you drawing  
10      your side arm and escalating it from a radio call?

11          A.     Well, it depends. It's hard to answer  
12      that.

13          Q.     But if you had seen that, that would have  
14      concerned you?

15          A.     Oh, yeah. Absolutely.

16          Q.     In retrospect, do you think that's  
17      something you would have wanted or should have  
18      known that there were snipers in that building?

19          A.     Absolutely.

20          Q.     And I know we are jumping around a lot, so  
21      I'll try to orient you as much as possible. Please  
22      tell me if I'm not.

23                   At the peak of the number of folks  
24      around the AGR building, which I presume just kind  
25      of increased as the day went on?

1           A.     Yes.

2           Q.     A guesstimate as to how many folks were  
3 there?

4           A.     Oh, geez.  Honestly, anywhere from -- there  
5 were just so many and it was back and forth.

6                     I'd say anywhere from, like, maybe 80.  
7 Maybe.

8           Q.     Fair enough.

9                     What were your concerns with those  
10 folks?

11                    Like you had issues with them being on  
12 the fence line, but, like, what were you kind of  
13 thinking?

14           A.     I did.  I had a problem with that because I  
15 knew everybody else that was inside had to go  
16 through basically, like, security, and all these  
17 people that were on the outer fence line there,  
18 none of them went through security.  So it's very  
19 easy for somebody to pull out, whether it be a  
20 handgun or come over with a long gun.

21                    I mean, none of those people were  
22 obviously scanned through, so that raised concern  
23 to me.  And nobody said, you know, "Make sure  
24 nobody goes over there."

25                    That's why I called the deputy earlier

1 on in the day. Like, "Hey, somebody's over there.  
2 You know, somebody's basically keeping an eye."

3 I mean, I know that's my job is to keep  
4 an eye on that fence line, make sure nobody jumps  
5 over or anything like that, but when you have so  
6 many people over there, it's hard to keep an eye on  
7 everybody --

8 Q. Yeah.

9 A. -- to make sure.

10 Q. I'm sorry. Go ahead.

11 A. No, no, no. You're fine.

12 Q. Well, I was going to ask: You know, I know  
13 you're looking out.

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. Of course, you're cognizant of where people  
16 are behind you.

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. Would you say it was pretty good visibility  
19 from that fence to the stage?

20 A. Yeah. Pretty good.

21 Q. Yeah. So would someone have had a clear --  
22 let's say they were just along the fence line --  
23 I'm not talking about the roof of AGR -- but with  
24 the fence line also, had they had a weapon, had a  
25 clear line on that?

1           A.     Yeah. From certain parts of the fence  
2 line, I believe so.

3           Q.     So my understanding -- please tell me if  
4 I'm wrong -- Pennsylvania is an open-carry state.  
5 Given it's outside the fence line, what are sort of  
6 the protocols for sort of balancing the legal right  
7 to carry and have a firearm openly versus being in  
8 that place near a presidential candidate?

9           A.     Yeah. I mean, people can carry, open carry  
10 like that. That's fine. I mean, I see people do  
11 it all the time. But a lot of times you don't see  
12 it like that --

13          Q.     Sure.

14          A.     -- in that area, you know.

15          Q.     But someone could have legally -- and I'm  
16 not in any way implying -- I'm just trying to  
17 track it -- someone could have legally had a gun in  
18 that area, and there's nothing you, as a sheriff,  
19 can do about it?

20          A.     On the outside of it like that if they were  
21 open carrying.

22          Q.     Got it. But I assume had you seen a  
23 citizen with a weapon, that would have escalated --

24          A.     Raised concern, yes.

25          Q.     -- your interest? Yes.

1           Okay. And I'm going to skip around a  
2 whole bunch more here. I want to talk about the  
3 radio channels.

4           So I feel pretty good about my  
5 understanding that the radio channels that you,  
6 EMS, Butler Township PD, Butler ESU, it's all a

7 [REDACTED]  
8 [REDACTED]?

9           Is that fair?

10          A. That's correct.

11          Q. Got it. You're on a sheriff's channel, but  
12 there are other channels; is that right?

13          A. Correct.

14          Q. From reading through, it seems there was an  
15 OPS 3.

16           Are you familiar with that terminology,  
17 or is that not really what you guys --

18          A. No. There is an OPS 3 on the radio.

19          Q. Were you aware of who was on OPS 3 that  
20 day?

21          A. So I did not know exactly who was on OPS 3  
22 or OPS 4. I knew the ESU team was on one of them,  
23 and I knew that Butler Township, who was in the  
24 area, was on the other.

25           I wasn't sure exactly who was on what,

1       which is why I scanned.

2           Q.     Yeah. Got it. So you knew Butler PD and  
3       ESU were on 3 and 4?

4           A.     Yes.

5           Q.     Who was OPS 2 and/or patrol?

6                   We've seen that reference. Is that  
7       separate?

8           A.     There's like a Police 2, which is all,  
9       like, the northern part of the county, which is  
10      considered Butler City, Butler Township. Those  
11      guys use that as their everyday radio, Police 2.

12          Q.     Got it. So that's separate from anyone  
13      who's there; is that right?

14          A.     Yeah. Unless they were scanning, yes.

15          Q.     I'm going to go a bit more to the radio  
16      because it just seems relevant right now. You said  
17      you were scanning.

18                   Did you hear anyone -- so when you hear  
19      that there's a gun, do you remember what channel  
20      that was on?

21          A.     I don't know. I was scanning.

22          Q.     That's fine.

23          A.     So I'm not sure. It was either, I think,  
24      OPS 3 or OPS 4, but I don't know for sure. I  
25      wasn't looking.

1                   If you watch the radio, you can see who  
2 calls out on what, but I wasn't.

3           Q.     At that point you're driving; is that  
4 right?

5           A.     Yeah. I already had it in.

6           Q.     Got it. What do you hear on the radio that  
7 you recall?

8                   After shots fired -- after you hear he  
9 has a gun, what do you hear on the radio next?

10          A.     After I hear that there's a long gun, I  
11 call it out on the radio.

12          Q.     On the sheriff's channel?

13          A.     On the sheriff's channel, yes. Let my guys  
14 know. And then immediately I heard the shots  
15 fired.

16                   When I went to go radio back up to say,  
17 "Shots fired," you're not able to if somebody else  
18 is trying to key up on there, which was Deputy  
19 [REDACTED]. He was already on the radio saying,  
20 "Shots fired," then, which was two seconds after I  
21 called out the long gun.

22          Q.     And if you are radioing in -- so you  
23 hear -- presume that it's OPS 3, long gun -- you go  
24 on the sheriff's channel, say, "He's armed," that  
25 would then prevent you from hearing someone on,

1 say, OPS 4, OPS 3 continuing to talk; is that  
2 right?

3 A. That's correct. But I also had on my  
4 portable, too.

5 Q. Okay. So tell me about -- were you able to  
6 hear anyone else talking while you were doing that?

7 A. So I could hear on my portable, if I speak  
8 on the car radio -- sorry. I'm kind of being  
9 confusing.

10 Q. No, you're not. You're good.

11 A. If I can speak on the car radio, I have  
12 this (indicating) on sheriff's channel; I have this  
13 (indicating) on Police OPS 3, my portable.

14 Q. Got it.

15 A. So I'm scanning on Police OPS 3 on my  
16 portable, but I have sheriff's channel on and I'm  
17 scanning in the car.

18 So if I talk on sheriff's channel in the  
19 car, it will cut off Police OPS 3, Police OPS 4.  
20 If they're talking, I can still hear while I'm  
21 talking on the sheriff's channel, if that makes  
22 sense.

23 Q. Yeah. Do you recall, between the time  
24 "Long gun on OPS 3" and then "Shots fired," do you  
25 recall anything on OPS 3 or OPS 4, or is it all



1 sort of jumbled?

2 A. No. Not --

3 Q. Do you recall specifically not hearing  
4 something or unsure?

5 A. No, I'm not sure. I know that there was  
6 talking, but I don't know exactly.

7 Q. And that's because you were focused on  
8 calling in?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. Got it.

11 The scanning, I just want to make sure  
12 I'm understanding this and maybe this is just  
13 stating my own interests.

14 So when it's scanning, it will just pick  
15 up if someone talks; is that right?

16 A. That's correct.

17 Q. Will it stay on that channel? Or, let's  
18 say, someone talks on OPS 3, blah, blah, blah,  
19 someone else talks on OPS 4 after that, blah, blah,  
20 blah, will it switch over to OPS 4, or will it just  
21 stay on the most recent channel until you hit Scan  
22 again?

23 A. So on the sheriff's channel, that's  
24 priority. So if Police OPS 3 is talking and  
25 somebody keys up on the sheriff's channel, it will

1 cut them off on 3.

2 Q. Got it.

3 A. Because that's my priority right there is  
4 the sheriff's channel.

5 So anybody that talks on the sheriff's  
6 channel, it will cut off everybody else on 3-4.  
7 It doesn't matter what radio it is.

8 If nobody's talking on the sheriff's  
9 channel, then it will let Police OPS 3 talk until  
10 however long.

11 Q. Then when they're done, will it bounce to  
12 4, 3, whatever, whoever is next to talk?

13 A. Yep. Whoever is talking. I can go to  
14 Police 2, Police 1.

15 Q. So other than your priority channel, it  
16 will then just go to whomever is the one speaking.  
17 And if someone speaks first, it will go until  
18 they're done and then maybe to someone else?

19 A. That's correct.

20 Q. Got it. Okay. All right. I think I've  
21 asked you enough questions about radios. I want to  
22 go to the attempt to disperse folks along the fence  
23 line.

24 So my understanding, you said you went  
25 over. You saw two men interacting around 1700 and

1       one was the owner of the AGR and wanted people out;  
2       is that right?

3       A.     Yeah.   That's who we said.

4       Q.     Yeah.   And then what kind of happened?

5               Did you guys just say, "Hey, get out of  
6       here," and that's it, or what happened next?

7       A.     Yeah.   So after I got the trooper, we  
8       walked over and told everybody, you know, "If you  
9       you're going to be over here, you need to be on the  
10      opposite side of the tree," which was kind of near  
11      68, the road there.

12      Q.     Do you mind, with an X, on Exhibit Alpha,  
13      drawing where you wanted folks to go?

14      A.     Yeah.

15      Q.     And if it's an arrow, that's fine, too.

16      A.     Kind of on the other side of this  
17      (indicating).

18      Q.     What was the reason --

19      A.     If you can see.

20      Q.     I've come prepared to this.   I have a  
21      Sharpie.

22               What was your reasoning for having folks  
23      go there?

24      A.     So this is what the trooper said:   He said  
25      that apparently that is the cutoff of the AGR

1 building. Anything on the other side of that tree  
2 was not them.

3 I don't know the specifics of it, but  
4 that's what the trooper told everybody, was to go  
5 on the opposite side of that tree.

6 The owner of the AGR building didn't  
7 have a problem with people being on the other side  
8 of that tree. So I assumed it wasn't property of  
9 the AGR building there.

10 Q. So it was your concern, really, these  
11 persons -- and I don't want to trivialize it  
12 here -- but it was just like, "Hey, this is his  
13 property. Get off the property"?

14 Was your focus on these people are just  
15 way too close?

16 What was kind of the mindset there going  
17 over?

18 A. Like my opinion?

19 Q. Your opinion, yes. Yes, your opinion.

20 A. My opinion was I don't think anybody should  
21 have been over there at all.

22 Q. Yeah.

23 A. Like I said, nobody went through security  
24 or anything. So...

25 Q. And that's exactly where I'm going next.

1                   So you went over, and then at that  
2 point -- tell me if I'm wrong -- you and [REDACTED] go  
3 back to your post at 4 and 5, and then he uses your  
4 phone to try to get someone to get over in the AGR  
5 area?

6           A.     That's correct.

7           Q.     From PSP or who knows?

8           A.     From PSP, yes.

9                   Like I said, we have this list, and when  
10 he used my phone, I didn't have the guy's phone  
11 number in here. So I kind of looked on here, who  
12 did he call, and it was his corporal. Now I can  
13 see it.

14                   But that's who he called and basically  
15 said, "There's a bunch of people over here. Can  
16 you get somebody over here to kind of disperse?"

17           Q.     Got it. So you go over the fence line.  
18 You try to get these guys away. You're thinking  
19 hey, there are too many people here. Way too  
20 close.

21                   PSP [REDACTED] agrees. He uses your phone  
22 to get someone from PSP to clear out because you  
23 guys are on the opposite side of the fence, and  
24 that's where it stayed at about 17 -- 1715; is that  
25 right?

1 A. That was 1715, correct.

2 Q. Got it. I think I understand.

3 So I want to ask the suspicious -- the  
4 picture of what ended up being Mr. Crooks came  
5 across from [REDACTED].

6 Was that 45 or 15 that you started  
7 hearing chatter that there was a suspicious  
8 individual?

9 A. That was like 1740, 1745, I believe.  
10 Somewhere around there.

11 Q. And when you eventually got that picture, I  
12 know it was much later, closer to the time of the  
13 shooting.

14 Are you able to say that was the picture  
15 of Crooks?

16 A. You mean after this?

17 Q. Do you now know that that was a picture of  
18 Crooks?

19 A. Oh, yes, yes.

20 Q. Of him on the wall?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. And around at that point, looking back on  
23 it, actually, do you ever have a recollection of  
24 seeing someone matching Crooks' description?

25 A. No.

1 Q. And perhaps that's because you said there  
2 were 80-plus people around?

3 A. Correct.

4 Q. You said at no point did you ever see  
5 Crooks on the roof; is that right?

6 A. That's correct.

7 Q. And you never went up to the roof  
8 afterwards?

9 A. That's correct.

10 Q. With a star -- I'm giving you this back one  
11 more time and I'm going to give you the Sharpie --  
12 do you mind with a star marking on the map  
13 approximately where you were when shots were fired?

14 You get out of your car. Pull out your  
15 handgun; is that right?

16 A. Yeah. I was probably right here  
17 (indicating) when shots were fired.

18 Q. And from that vantage point, you could not  
19 see Mr. Crooks?

20 A. I could not.

21 Q. Where -- and I don't need you to mark this  
22 but I'm just curious -- from any point along  
23 outside the fence line within your patrol  
24 perimeter -- I know you were at 4 -- would it have  
25 been possible from any point on ground level to see

1 Crooks?

2 A. No. You mean up on the roof?

3 Q. Yes. Sorry.

4 A. No. I don't believe so.

5 Q. What about from within near the AGR  
6 complex?

7 I know you weren't over there, but to  
8 your knowledge, let's say from the trees that we  
9 see on Exhibit Alpha to the left or west of the AGR  
10 complex, it looks like there's a little rise.

11 From that hill, from those trees, could  
12 you potentially have seen him?

13 A. Oh, yes. If you're back here (indicating),  
14 absolutely.

15 [REDACTED]: And just for the record,  
16 the witness pointed to the trees to the west of the  
17 AGR complex.

18 Q. But within that sort of no man's land, you  
19 guys couldn't see?

20 A. No. It was too hard. You couldn't see  
21 over the peak of it.

22 Q. Got it. Okay. I asked most of the  
23 questions I had for clarity.

24 [REDACTED]: Can I get a time check?  
25 My apologies.



1 [REDACTED]: You've got roughly ten  
2 minutes.

3 [REDACTED]: Oh, super. We're doing  
4 great here.

5 BY [REDACTED]:

6 Q. I want to talk about, then, rewinding all  
7 the way, prior rallies, have you worked a prior  
8 political rally?

9 A. I did.

10 Q. Which one was that?

11 A. I worked the Trump rally.

12 Q. 2020?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. Got it. And we have heard from other folks  
15 that that was at a different location, different --  
16 not this airstrip -- a different place.

17 A. Correct.

18 Q. Got it. Any impressions on this location  
19 as a rally?

20 Did you have any concerns about the farm  
21 grounds, anything, before you showed up that day?

22 A. No. So like I said, I've never been to the  
23 Farm Show grounds before.

24 Q. You did say that.

25 A. And when I did go there, that was my main

1 concern, was that building, and that's why I called  
2 the deputy and said, you know, "Do you think  
3 somebody's over here?"

4 Other than that, I couldn't see where  
5 everybody else was. Like I said, I don't know the  
6 area, so I'm not sure. But that raised concern to  
7 me when I first got there, and I just thought this  
8 is probably not a really good location.

9 Q. It seems pretty obvious; right?

10 A. Yeah.

11 Q. What is your relationship as a Butler  
12 sheriff officer?

13 My understanding, you guys aren't part  
14 of the ESU; is that right?

15 A. We are not.

16 Q. What is your relationship with -- and just  
17 a general working relationship -- with the Butler  
18 ESU?

19 Do you guys interact or not really?

20 A. No. We don't really interact that much  
21 unless we were needed for something. But we don't  
22 ever really interact with them.

23 I've only been with them one time, and  
24 that was years ago when there was a riot that was  
25 Downtown Butler, and Butler city police was there,

1 the ESU was there, we were there, and we kind of  
2 all worked together there.

3 But other than that, they don't call us  
4 for anything and we don't really need them.

5 Q. What about Butler Township Police  
6 Department?

7 What's the interaction there?

8 A. I mean, we back them up sometimes if they  
9 need anything. I mean, if they need something,  
10 they would call us. It's not abnormal.

11 Q. What about Pennsylvania State Police?

12 A. If we ever need them for anything.  
13 Normally we need them more than they would need us.  
14 They would only need us for, like, a transport or  
15 something. But it's not abnormal if either of us  
16 call each other.

17 Q. Understood. And then Secret Service, you  
18 said, you worked in 2020. To the extent you have  
19 other impressions or just generally, any -- first  
20 of all, you didn't have any interaction with Secret  
21 Service for this event; is that correct?

22 A. That's correct.

23 Q. What about the 2020 event?

24 A. Yeah. I actually had a female with me in  
25 my car.

1           Q.    What are your general impressions from the  
2           legal level of organization and structure that you  
3           had at 2020 versus this event?

4           A.    It seemed more squared away than it was  
5           now.

6           Q.    Yeah.  And I know I'm putting you on the  
7           spot, and this isn't to call it out.

8                     Just from you being there, as a law  
9           enforcement person needing to know what the heck  
10          you're supposed to do, can you expound a little bit  
11          on the squared-away nature?

12          A.    I mean, I just think it was -- lack of  
13          communication is a better term, I guess, because  
14          before, for the 2020, we were kind of all briefed  
15          together with the Secret Service and us.  That's  
16          how, obviously, I knew I had that female with me.

17                     We kind of were told, "Okay.  This is  
18          where your post is.  This is what you're going to  
19          do.  Here's what times he's coming.  Here's, you  
20          know, what everybody's going to do."

21                     This time it was sent out by e-mail,  
22          "Show up at 10:45 at your post, and here you go."

23          Q.    Yeah.

24          A.    Nobody said where everybody was going to  
25          be.  I had no idea other than the map here.

1           Q.    Yeah.  And, you know, we talked about one  
2   issue of not having the cognizance of where folks  
3   were was relevant.  Like you see someone with a  
4   long gun at the AGR, that could raise some alarms.

5                   Any other things like that where you're  
6   like, "Hey, I really wish I had known X"?

7           A.    No.  I mean, that.  I wish I would have  
8   known that.

9           Q.    Sure.

10          A.    That would have been nice.  But like I  
11   said, I couldn't see him in there, anyway, so I had  
12   no idea, and clearly neither did the guy at Post 6.

13          Q.    Got it.  Yeah, we won't speak ill of the  
14   guy at Post 6; right?

15          A.    Yeah.  No, we won't.

16          Q.    Okay.  You had your cellphone, radio.  You  
17   don't have FirstNet or FrontLine; is that right?

18          A.    That's correct.

19          Q.    One's Verizon; one's AT&T?  Cool.

20          A.    I had Verizon.

21          Q.    Do you know if that was available to your  
22   office?

23                   Does your office have handsets with that  
24   capability?

25          A.    No.

1 Q. Briefly, you were asked about drone  
2 usage --

3 [REDACTED]: And please stop me  
4 whenever I'm done.

5 Q. Drone usage: You didn't see any drones;  
6 right?

7 A. I did not.

8 Q. That would be another thing: If you see a  
9 drone, you're like, "Hold on a minute. What's  
10 going on?"

11 A. That would have been a red flag.

12 Q. Were there drones at the 2020 event?

13 A. I couldn't see anything from where I was.  
14 I was along the wood line, so...

15 Q. Now, these are some quick-hitters here.

16 You're in your vehicle most of the day.  
17 Is that just like, hey, that's where we need to be  
18 to respond to stuff?

19 What's the reason to be in the vehicle  
20 versus out of the vehicle versus patrolling along  
21 the fence line?

22 What's the --

23 A. I don't know. He just said, meaning "he,"  
24 the chief, just said kind of, "Sit in your vehicle  
25 and watch the fence line. If somebody was to try

1 to jump or do anything or you see anything  
2 suspicious over there, just call it in and we'll  
3 handle it."

4 But other than that, we weren't to walk  
5 around and do anything. We were just kind of  
6 watching that area.

7 Q. Makes sense. I want to ask you. You may  
8 have seen reports about a range finder here. Let  
9 me ask you this: Did you see anyone with a range  
10 finder?

11 A. I did not.

12 Q. Had you seen someone with a range finder,  
13 you know, is that something you would expect? Is  
14 that something that would raise red flags?

15 Tell me.

16 A. That would be red flags, yeah.

17 Q. We haven't talked about any interactions  
18 that you have had with any other law enforcement  
19 agency beyond your colleague with PSP.

20 Is that fair to say, that throughout the  
21 day, you really didn't have much beyond [REDACTED], PSP,  
22 and Deputy [REDACTED]?

23 A. That's true.

24 Q. I want to get to the communications with  
25 Sergeant [REDACTED].

1                   He said -- looking at the radio logs, it  
2                   appears he gave you a description of a male on a  
3                   bicycle.

4                   Tell me if this wrong: You saw someone.  
5                   Relayed the description. It wasn't who they were  
6                   looking for. And you never saw the individual who  
7                   eventually matched Mr. Crooks' depiction; is that  
8                   right?

9                   A. That's correct.

10                  Q. The individual you saw on a bicycle was  
11                  someone else?

12                  A. That's correct.

13                  Q. Did anything ever come of that?

14                  A. No.

15                  Q. Just someone else?

16                  A. I mean, it was just some guy that wanted to  
17                  see Trump.

18                  Q. Got it. And you eventually received it --  
19                  let's say shots fired at 1811 -- you eventually  
20                  receive the picture at 1808, 1809?

21                         Does that seem about right?

22                  A. When I actually seen the picture, yes.

23                  Q. Because, otherwise, you had the e-mail, but  
24                  it was loading slowly?

25                  A. Yes. It was loading, yes.



1           Q.    Understood. All right. My last bit -- and  
2           I'm glad we've got through this and my apologies  
3           for the length and loquaciousness -- but what  
4           interviews have you participated in post July 13th?

5           A.    I had one in the courthouse. It was with  
6           the state police and somebody from the FBI. I  
7           can't really remember his name.

8                    I was supposed to meet with somebody  
9           else from the FBI. They called the day prior, and  
10          we had a time at 2:00 to meet at the courthouse.  
11          But then when I showed up to work the next day, the  
12          sheriff said, "Okay, everybody's being interviewed  
13          by the state police," and this person with the FBI.

14                   And so then, after that, I never  
15          actually interviewed with this other guy because he  
16          ended up talking to me. They said, "You don't have  
17          to do it twice."

18                   I was supposed to be interviewed again,  
19          but I was in Florida. So whoever set up that date  
20          and time didn't check with me. So...

21          Q.    Got it.

22          A.    Just the one time.

23          Q.    Just the one time.

24                   Anything from that that was discussed  
25          that you think would be relevant for us to know?

1 A. No, I don't. I don't believe so.

2 Q. Similar stuff?

3 A. Yeah. All similar.

4 Q. Last three questions:

5 So I am sure you have seen the coverage  
6 of this event and discussions of this event in the  
7 media, by, perhaps, some of the folks we work for.

8 Do you have any general reflection on  
9 how it's been covered or things that you feel are  
10 inaccurate or that you think would be worthwhile  
11 for us to know?

12 A. I mean, not really. Like I said, it all  
13 comes down to communication. I mean, I think it  
14 was a lack of communication for everybody. That  
15 was my main thing.

16 I mean, as little as communication with  
17 PSP or communication with Secret Service, I mean I  
18 don't know where the -- it fell down there, but...

19 Q. Someone else --

20 A. Somebody didn't relay the information or  
21 they did and -- I don't know. But like I said, I  
22 was just at my post and that's all I could do. I  
23 did the best I could.

24 I relayed the information that I could,  
25 let them use my phone, and I think maybe had

1 somebody been over there and gotten those people  
2 out of there, I think I definitely would have seen  
3 Crooks at least walking over in that area.

4 Maybe more law enforcement over there  
5 would have definitely been helpful, but other than  
6 that, it basically comes down to a lack of  
7 communication.

8 Q. Yeah. And that was my last question, and I  
9 think you answered it. But to the extent there's  
10 anything else, is there anything in retrospect --  
11 because it doesn't sound like you did anything  
12 beyond what you were supposed to do -- is there  
13 anything, looking back, either you wish -- that we  
14 haven't covered -- that you wish you either had  
15 known, had done differently, or that someone in a  
16 position of authority, either within your chain of  
17 command or other chains of command, had done  
18 differently beyond what we have spoken about  
19 otherwise?

20 A. No. I mean, you always look back at it and  
21 say, you know, "I wish this; I wish that."

22 Like part of me says, you know, instead  
23 of calling the deputy at Post 6, I wish I maybe  
24 would have went to somebody higher up, whether it  
25 be my chief or Sergeant [REDACTED]. You know, was

1 anybody over at that AGR building.

2 That way, I at least raised the issue  
3 and said, you know -- obviously, like I said  
4 earlier, it's a clear shot right there. I mean,  
5 nobody was going through security over there.

6 So I think maybe if I would have done  
7 that, I would have felt better myself bringing it  
8 up to somebody that's obviously higher than me  
9 because I'm just a deputy. So I can't really call  
10 the shots or anything.

11 Q. Yeah. Well, I appreciate that. Obviously,  
12 Deputy No. 6 will make sure that he gets spoken to.

13 A. Yeah.

14 Q. But I appreciate it.

15 [REDACTED]: Do you have anything  
16 further right now?

17 [REDACTED]: I think we're about at  
18 time.

19 [REDACTED]: Oh. Two minutes over. I  
20 appreciate the indulgence.

21 We are off the record at 1505.

22 [REDACTED]: We are back on the record  
23 at 3:08 p.m.

24 BY [REDACTED]:

25 Q. So you had mentioned that comp time was

1 given instead of overtime and that it changed a lot  
2 of people's minds.

3 Did that affect staffing of personnel,  
4 or was there a shortage or difficulty in terms of  
5 staffing as a result?

6 A. So originally when he threw it out there,  
7 it was for comp or overtime. There was -- I don't  
8 know the exact amount, but I know that there was a  
9 lot of guys that wanted to do it, and then once he  
10 said it was only for comp and not overtime, that  
11 changed a lot of people's minds.

12 Now, where he came up with the -- I  
13 don't know how many there were -- six or seven of  
14 us -- I don't know where that number came, but I do  
15 know that for the rally, you know, in 2020, we had  
16 more people -- double that -- there.

17 Q. So is it fair to say that you were all  
18 operating with less personnel than expected?

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. A large amount? A small amount in terms of  
21 at a less number, smaller number?

22 A. Yeah. It was small, I think, compared to  
23 what it should have been and what we were thinking.

24 Q. When you showed up day of, were you  
25 surprised at the number of folks that had been

1 staffing?

2 Was it that low?

3 A. Well, like I said, I did receive this a day  
4 prior. So I kind of was shocked that there was  
5 little, but like I said, I'm just a deputy, so I  
6 just roll with it.

7 Q. Did anyone express that they had felt sort  
8 of strained?

9 A. No.

10 Q. You also indicated there was no meeting the  
11 day of the event.

12 Were you concerned or did you raise the  
13 question with anyone regarding, you know, "Hey, why  
14 is there no meeting?"

15 A. No, I didn't. Not really. I mean, I did  
16 ask the chief when he called me. I said, you know,  
17 "Are we meeting anywhere kind of because we did in  
18 2020?" He said, "No. Just go to your post," and  
19 that was it. I didn't ask any more questions other  
20 than that.

21 Q. So there was no meeting or briefing so that  
22 folks knew what their jobs or their  
23 responsibilities or duties were that day?

24 A. No. No. He may have went into -- "he," as  
25 in the chief -- may have went into detail with

1 other deputies when he called them. I don't know.

2 All he told me was, "Hey, you're at Post  
3 4. I'm going to send you all the information.  
4 Watch the fence line." "Okay. Thank you."

5 Q. Got it. Thank you.

6 So how did folks know who was  
7 responsible from a coordination standpoint, you  
8 know, in terms of division of duties?

9 You had mentioned potentially they might  
10 have been told individually by via phone call or  
11 otherwise, but you're unaware of any other kind of  
12 coordination in terms of how people were told about  
13 what their responsibilities were?

14 A. That's correct, because like I said, there  
15 wasn't a meeting or anything or a debriefing like  
16 what there normally was and should have been.

17 So when we got this (indicating), the  
18 map with the list of officers and where their post  
19 is, I kind of just went off of there and knew, you  
20 know, the people around me were doing the same  
21 thing as I was.

22 Q. So would you sort of characterize this as a  
23 deviation from kind of standard procedure?

24 A. Yeah.

25 Q. Did you ever, at any juncture, ask for

1 someone from the Secret Service to be with you or  
2 any of the other officers, and did you ask why no  
3 one was with you for this event?

4 A. I did ask if I was going to have somebody  
5 from the Secret Service with me. I asked my chief  
6 that. He said no, I was going to be by myself and  
7 then explained it was going to be deputy/trooper,  
8 deputy/trooper, kind of separating us all.

9 I don't know why they did it that way,  
10 but I did ask because I knew, obviously, in 2020 I  
11 did have a member of the Secret Service with me.  
12 But he just said I was by myself, and I said okay.

13 Q. Moving on to sort of the communication  
14 channels, were you concerned about the siloing of  
15 all of these channels; i.e., the sheriff's channel,  
16 for example, or that there wasn't a main channel  
17 through which law enforcement could communicate?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. Did you communicate that concern to anyone?

20 A. I did. I don't know exactly when it was,  
21 but I did tell Sergeant [REDACTED] and the chief, you  
22 know, "We need to be able to talk to PSP. We need  
23 to be able to talk to," in my opinion, "Secret  
24 Service," I mean, in case there was an issue.

25 I know it's seconds to communicate



1 through radio, but then the guy at the command post  
2 has to tell somebody else, who then, by the time it  
3 gets to the right people, it's already too late, in  
4 my opinion.

5 Q. And did Sergeant [REDACTED] at any juncture  
6 indicate that there was capability in terms of  
7 creating some sort of main channel, or he just said  
8 this is sort of what it is?

9 A. He just said he's at the command post and  
10 he was with somebody from state police who was  
11 operating their guys.

12 So pretty much if anything came up, go  
13 through the sheriff channel. He'll tell the  
14 correct people in the command post.

15 Q. Do you know who made the decision to keep  
16 the channels siloed in that manner?

17 A. I do not know.

18 Q. Moving on to sort of the phone issues you  
19 had described, ma'am, as you were experiencing  
20 those service and phone issues, as a lot of folks  
21 were that day, as was the case with PSP, did  
22 anybody radio this in?

23 Was anyone making clear or communicating  
24 that, you know, getting in touch with each other  
25 via cellphone was becoming an issue?

1           A.    Yes.  I believe it was Sergeant [REDACTED] said  
2   he was trying to send a picture, and I told him,  
3   "You can try to send it all you want, but my  
4   phone's not working."  And this was all over the  
5   radio.

6                    So we were all kind of going back and  
7   forth, and a couple of the other deputies said that  
8   their phone wasn't working either.

9           Q.    Did anyone sort of offer any kind of  
10  remedial measures or remediation to the phone  
11  issues?

12          A.    No.  Just used a radio.

13          Q.    So sort of leading into my next question  
14  with respect to the sort of telephonic issues  
15  there, did you switch then to using radio  
16  primarily?

17          A.    Yes, because at that point, I mean, my  
18  phone wasn't working for -- I don't even know.  
19  Like I said, it was off and on.  I turned it off  
20  and on, but it was probably like that for, like, a  
21  good hour and a half maybe.

22                    So I mean, I always knew if I needed  
23  something on the radio is the way to go.

24          Q.    And did any other officers mention over the  
25  radio they were having issues with their

1       telephones, as well?

2           A.     Yes.

3           Q.     What was the instruction following, you  
4       know, officers making that sort of communication  
5       that they were having issues?

6                   Did anyone sort of say, "Continue to try  
7       to use your phones. Please switch to radio"?

8                   No instructions were given?

9           A.     No. Just, "Anything that needs brought up,  
10      bring it up on the sheriff channel." That was it.

11          Q.     Was it your understanding that it was  
12      Sergeant [REDACTED]'s duty or role to be the liaison  
13      between the sheriff's office and the Secret  
14      Service?

15                   Can you sort of expand for me on what,  
16      you know, your understanding was as to who he was  
17      serving as a liaison for?

18          A.     So I did ask, and he said that he was with  
19      PSP but that Secret Service was in their own  
20      command post.

21                   I don't know the specifics. That's just  
22      what he told me because, obviously, it raised  
23      concern to me and anybody in law enforcement. I  
24      mean, how do you communicate with somebody, the  
25      people next to you, when you can't?

1                   So, yeah. That's just what he told me.  
2           I'm not 100 percent sure about that.

3           Q.     So if you, hypothetically, wanted to get in  
4           touch with PSP or the Secret Service or any other  
5           sort of entity, that was all going through Sergeant  
6           [REDACTED]?

7           A.     Correct. Unless I drove to the guy at  
8           Post 5.

9           Q.     Right.

10          A.     Which I have multiple times.

11          Q.     All right. We're going to move into sort  
12          of right around the time of the shooting now and  
13          then sort of ask you some kind of questions right  
14          after that, ma'am.

15                   So it's our understanding that at  
16          approximately 6:09 p.m., Deputy [REDACTED] asked if  
17          1126 was able to see the roof of the AGR.

18                   Do you recall that radio transmission?

19          A.     A little bit.

20          Q.     And just to be clear, 1126 is you; correct?

21          A.     Is me, correct.

22          Q.     And do you recall where you were located  
23          when that radio transmission occurred?

24          A.     If that was before the shots were fired, I  
25          was probably sitting at my post looking at that

1 picture.

2 Q. Okay. Shortly before the shooting, from  
3 what we understand, you were asked if you could see  
4 the AGR roof.

5 Do you know why you were asked that?

6 A. Well, I know he was scanning, as well. So  
7 he could hear the radio traffic of what they were  
8 saying while near the AGR building.

9 Q. And how were sheriff's deputies and the  
10 local police able to communicate about a suspicious  
11 person?

12 A. Well, we were told to only stay on the  
13 sheriff channel. I took it upon myself to scan.

14 So if I did need to say something to the  
15 township or anything like that, I would just switch  
16 to whether it be Police OPS 3 - 4 or Police 2.

17 Q. Do you believe that the Secret Service was  
18 also listening to local radio communications at  
19 that point in time?

20 A. I didn't think they were. I still don't  
21 know if they were or not.

22 Q. So if you were sort of looking in the  
23 direction of the AGR roof at approximately 6:09  
24 p.m. that day -- well, let me sort of backtrack  
25 here.

1                   Do you recall, sort of right before the  
2 shooting, where you were directed in terms of your  
3 sight line, what you were looking at?

4                   Were you scanning or what were you  
5 doing?

6           A.     Yeah. I mean, I was scanning, yeah. I was  
7 still trying to look for Crooks.

8           Q.     So if we move from 6:09 p.m., about 90  
9 seconds later, from what we understand, you had  
10 said over the radio, "10-4, he's armed."

11                   Can you walk us through that period of  
12 time?

13           A.     Yeah. So as I was trying to look through  
14 the people, like I said, I could see Butler  
15 Township kind of running with a purpose. I'll use  
16 that word.

17                   I figured they could see him. Once I  
18 heard them call that out, that he was armed with a  
19 long gun, that's when I then called it on my radio  
20 because like I said, we were told to only call out  
21 and listen to the sheriff's channel.

22                   So I wanted the rest of my guys there to  
23 know, you know, what was happening in case they  
24 weren't scanning.

25           Q.     Moving sort of post shooting, did you

1 receive any communications or, you know, updated  
2 information from the Secret Service regarding what  
3 you should do?

4 A. No.

5 Q. What was your assignment after the  
6 shooting?

7 Did you assist with the state police or  
8 the Secret Service?

9 A. I did. Nobody told me to, but I was  
10 obviously next to the trooper at Post 5, and I kind  
11 of helped him out with what he needed and, like I  
12 said, to get the ESU guys through there so they can  
13 get over to the building

14 BY [REDACTED]:

15 Q. Was it the trooper at 5 that was ramming  
16 the fence that you had talked about?

17 A. Yeah, he was the -- yep.

18 Q. That was the one?

19 A. Yep. He's a trooper.

20 BY [REDACTED]:

21 Q. And following the shooting, were there any  
22 discussions going on regarding failures on the  
23 ground?

24 Can you sort of describe the general  
25 mood and discussions that were going on?

1 Specifically, what Secret Service should have been  
2 doing, what law enforcement should have been doing?

3 A. You mean like right after?

4 Q. Yes.

5 A. I mean, guys were obviously upset. I mean,  
6 everybody had their own opinion on things, but  
7 basically we thought because he used my phone, like  
8 I said, at 1715 -- that was almost an hour prior to  
9 the shots being fired -- we thought that if  
10 somebody would have come over there and got all  
11 those people out of there, that this may not have  
12 happened.

13 I guess on -- I don't want to put the  
14 blame on anybody because it's not like that, but  
15 the sheriff's office is so limited on what we do.  
16 You know, we can't-- that's why I kind of told the  
17 trooper to tell his people to go because we were  
18 all at post, everybody that was -- meaning  
19 deputies -- at the sheriff's office. And, plus, we  
20 don't really have that to get people out of there,  
21 anyway.

22 So I think guys were upset about that  
23 because the call was made almost an hour prior, and  
24 then guys were obviously upset because then they  
25 thought maybe Secret Service should have had



1       somebody up on that roof.

2               I mean, that's it.

3       Q.     And once you became aware that there was  
4       someone with a range finder, would it be fair to  
5       say that that individual should have been detained?

6       A.     Absolutely.

7       Q.     And who would have been responsible for  
8       that detainment?

9       A.     I don't even know who was over there, to be  
10      honest with you. I know there's a lot of state  
11      police guys that weren't actually at post. So I  
12      don't know if maybe they could have been utilized.  
13      I'm not sure who would have.

14             Like I said, I know that Butler Township  
15      was out there, too. So whoever it would be, I mean  
16      somebody could have done it.

17      Q.     Were you surprised with the amount of time  
18      that elapsed from when there was an ID of a  
19      suspicious person, that that person looked as  
20      though he had a range finder and then that that  
21      person was then able to make it onto the rooftop of  
22      the AGR building?

23      A.     Yeah. That's -- I feel like a lot of time  
24      passed.

25      Q.     And did you participate in any debriefings

1 following July 13?

2 A. Yeah, I did. I did.

3 Q. And did the Secret Service attend those  
4 debriefings?

5 A. No.

6 Q. Did the Secret Service provide you with any  
7 sort of after-action or other sort of debrief  
8 information?

9 A. No.

10 Q. Has the Secret Service spoken to you since  
11 July 13th?

12 A. No.

13 Q. Who was a part of the debriefings that you  
14 attended?

15 A. I went to the one, but it wasn't really --  
16 I don't even know if you want to call it a  
17 debriefing. I didn't stay the whole time because  
18 it was not -- you know, there was just a bunch of  
19 people from, like, the EMS and everybody that were  
20 there. So it really wasn't much of anything.

21 Then we went to the [REDACTED]  
22 and it was us deputies that were there. Honestly,  
23 I'm not even sure who the two guys were that put it  
24 on. I can't even say because I don't even know who  
25 they were with.

But other than that, that was it. We never got together with PSP, Secret Service, Butler Township, nothing like that.

Q. So was there a presentation given?

A. Not really, no.

BY [REDACTED]:

Q. [REDACTED]'s gone through most of what I had.

The squad that you were using that day, was it equipped with, like, a dash cam or MVR system?

A. No.

Q. No? Okay.

And you said that you had concerns about the folks on the opposite side of the fence line from you over by AGR because they hadn't been screened.

How did you know that the people at the rally had been screened?

A. We actually had a deputy at the main gate there that was, you know, getting them through.

Q. Okay. So you knew because --

A. So I did know because of that, yeah, that all the people that were going through were being screened.

Q. But it's not because of any information

1       that Secret Service had given you?

2           A.     No.

3           Q.     Last question kind of going back to just  
4       some of the communication:

5                     Were you aware, during the day or when  
6       you first got there, what time former President  
7       Trump was supposed to arrive at the rally?

8           A.     I did ask Sergeant [REDACTED], and he said 1700  
9       hours is when he was supposed to come. That  
10      obviously got pushed back. He said that he was  
11      going to be late.

12          Q.     How was that communicated to you?

13          A.     Over the radio.

14          Q.     Actually, I guess, I have one more.

15                     After the shooting, you helped a PSP  
16      trooper open up the gate. Did you see any Secret  
17      Service personnel go towards the AGR building at  
18      that time?

19          A.     I didn't really. I was more on -- I mean,  
20      it's hard to explain it -- but I was more on this  
21      part (indicating) of the gate trying to help them.

22                     So I'm not sure, unless they went --  
23      it's all gated in there. I mean, the only way  
24      you're getting around it is if you jump it.

25          Q.     Did you see any Secret Service personnel?

1           A.    I seen them all inside.  I'm not sure  
2           about -- I personally did not see them.  They may  
3           have went over there.  I personally did not see  
4           them.

5           Q.    That's all I have.

6           [REDACTED]:  And I think that's all we  
7           have.  We can go off the record.

8                     (Off the record.)

9   BY [REDACTED]:

10          Q.    We are back on the record at 1528.  This is  
11          [REDACTED] from the Minority.  I have a few  
12          questions.  I'm going to hand it off to my  
13          colleague.  I may have a few more, but that's about  
14          it.

15                     At any point, again, you have questions  
16          for us, please just let us know.

17          A.    Okay.

18          Q.    I want to ask you about the corporal that  
19          Trooper [REDACTED] called.  You said you saw his number  
20          on your phone?

21          A.    Yeah, because he used my phone.

22          Q.    And is that Corporal [REDACTED]?

23          A.    It is.

24          Q.    Okay.  So [REDACTED] calls [REDACTED], and at that  
25          point the impression that both you and [REDACTED] have

1 is that Corporal [REDACTED] is now going to figure out a  
2 way to clear out AGR?

3 A. Yeah. Like I said, I couldn't hear the  
4 phone conversation. It was really loud outside.  
5 So he put up his window while he used my phone.

6 So I'm not sure exactly what he said,  
7 but once he got off the phone and handed me my  
8 phone back, he did tell me. You know, I told him.  
9 He said he's going to send people over here,  
10 meaning other troopers, to clear it.

11 Q. And that never happened?

12 A. No.

13 Q. At any point did [REDACTED] ever say anything  
14 about that conversation beyond what he said around  
15 1750?

16 A. After the fact?

17 Q. After the fact. At any point.

18 A. No. I didn't really talk to him much  
19 after.

20 Q. So you don't have any knowledge of either  
21 what was specifically discussed or what Corporal  
22 [REDACTED] did to deal with that situation?

23 A. No, I don't know.

24 Q. And you mentioned the sheriff's office.  
25 You know, again, I'm just trying to understand some

1 of these law enforcement agencies.

2 You said you didn't call up because your  
3 sheriff's office doesn't have the assets to move  
4 anyone out of AGR.

5 Is that fair?

6 A. Yeah. And we were all at post, anyway.  
7 PSP had a lot of people floating around.

8 Q. Understood. We talked about a group text  
9 message thread in the first round of this go-round.

10 Is there anything on that thread  
11 relevant beyond the, let's say, 1700 timeframe, or  
12 was all discussion carried out via radio after  
13 that?

14 A. It was all via radio.

15 Q. You mentioned with my colleagues earlier  
16 about your concern about communications and not  
17 having channels, and you said you expressed that to  
18 Sergeant [REDACTED]; is that right?

19 A. Correct.

20 Q. When did that happen?

21 A. It was earlier in the day when I said that.  
22 But I always say that. I always say we should be  
23 able to communicate with the state police and the  
24 state police should be able to communicate with us.

25 And especially at events like this, I

1       feel like the Secret Service should be able to hear  
2       us and we should be able to hear them. I mean,  
3       it's easier to tell somebody directly than to go  
4       through a third person.

5       Q.     And so that happened, total estimate,  
6       let's say earlier in the day?

7       A.     Not too long after I got there, yeah.

8       Q.     So we're talking in the morning?

9       A.     In the morning, yeah, sometime.

10      Q.     And then what was [REDACTED]'s response to that?

11             I know you said it, but just tell me  
12      that one more time.

13      A.     He just said go through the sheriff's  
14      channel and he's at the command post and he'll  
15      relay the information.

16      Q.     Got it. So he was like, "Hey, I'm the  
17      focus of this, and then I'll pass it on"?

18      A.     Yes.

19      Q.     You said it is unusual for someone in your  
20      position to scan the radio in terms of you could  
21      but most people don't?

22      A.     Yeah. Some people don't. It just depends.  
23      Like some deputies just want to focus on -- if  
24      you're told to only be on the sheriff's channel,  
25      that's what some deputies will do. They won't go



1 any further than that.

2 Some people, like me, who I want to be  
3 able to hear everybody around me, I do scan.

4 Q. And that enabled you to hear the OPS 3 call  
5 out a long gun?

6 A. Yes, especially because where I was, where  
7 I was positioned, and from what was relayed on the  
8 radio, who we were looking for, he was last seen  
9 around the AGR building, I really wanted to scan  
10 then because I knew local law enforcement was  
11 around that building. I could see them. So I  
12 wanted to be able to hear what they were saying.

13 Q. And that 1808 through shots fired 1811  
14 timeframe, you're looking at the building?

15 A. I'm looking at the building and the crowd  
16 of people in front of me.

17 Q. What are you observing about the crowd?

18 What do they seem to be looking at?

19 A. At first, they were just watching, and  
20 then --

21 Q. Watching the building or watching Trump?

22 A. No. Watching Trump. And then you see  
23 people running before shots were even fired.

24 So I was really listening to the radio.  
25 That's when I seen Butler Township run around, and,

1 I'm telling you, people just started running. I  
2 heard him call out "Long gun" on the radio, so I  
3 did. And that's when the shots fired and then  
4 everybody ran.

5 Q. And I'm sure this kind of all seemed to  
6 jumble, happen at once.

7 So people are looking at Trump. Then  
8 you see crowds scattering slowly, police running  
9 around the building, then shots.

10 At what point do you drive over to  
11 Trooper [REDACTED]? During that period?

12 A. Yeah. It was probably -- I don't know the  
13 exact, but I do know I was in drive when the shots  
14 were fired. I do know that.

15 So it was before he called out that  
16 there was a long gun. It was right then because I  
17 was already in drive while I was saying it.

18 Q. When did the people, civilians around the  
19 AGR, start scattering?

20 How long before you were in drive?

21 A. Seconds maybe. I don't know. 30 seconds  
22 or something.

23 Q. 30 seconds before you were in drive?

24 A. Yeah. 15 to 30 seconds I seen people just  
25 start running, and it was mostly the people in the

1 back.

2 People on the fence line were just  
3 sitting there. People in the back were running  
4 towards 68. And I thought, obviously, weird. I  
5 put the car in drive. I want to show my partner  
6 the picture -- well, the trooper.

7 While I was doing that, I was listening  
8 to the radio. I heard them call out, "He has a  
9 gun, long gun." I called it out on the radio.  
10 Once the shots were fired, I put it in park.

11 Q. Got it. So just to make it clear for  
12 everyone, because I think I'm tracking, but let's  
13 say a minute before shots fired is when you see  
14 people, not on the fence line, but maybe people  
15 behind a little bit start moving away from the AGR  
16 complex; is that right?

17 A. Yeah. It was maybe like 30 seconds prior  
18 to the shots fired.

19 Q. Is when people start moving?

20 A. That people started, yeah, running away  
21 from.

22 Q. In your mind, is that consistent with maybe  
23 them seeing -- obviously this is speculation -- is  
24 that consistent with them seeing him have a gun?

25 A. Oh, I definitely think they seen him up

1       there.

2           Q.     And we earlier talked on Minority Exhibit  
3       No. 1, but that was the area up the hill to the  
4       left of AGR, to the west of AGR; is that right?

5           A.     Yes.

6           Q.     So those are the people, in that position,  
7       who have the ability to look down and potentially  
8       see where Crooks was?

9           A.     That's correct.

10          Q.     Got it.

11                   I want to talk about hypotheticals here,  
12       which I know is tough, but we talked earlier about  
13       someone in the AGR with a rifle.

14                   At that point -- because at a certain  
15       point it goes from reporting it to you drawing a  
16       gun, I would assume; right?

17          A.     Yeah.

18          Q.     At what point would seeing someone with a  
19       weapon around AGR have caused you to escalate from  
20       reporting to potentially deploying lethal force?

21          A.     Well, I mean, it's all -- I couldn't really  
22       see the window or anything there, anyway. So I  
23       probably wouldn't have seen that.

24                   But if I would have seen somebody, in  
25       general, it would have raised -- it all depends.

1 If I would have just seen the long gun and  
2 nobody -- you know, if I seen somebody in uniform,  
3 I mean, it's all --

4 Q. It depends?

5 A. Yeah. It's hard to answer.

6 Q. Understood. So it's fair to say had you  
7 been in a position -- so if you had seen Crooks  
8 with a rifle not wearing military gear, you would  
9 have felt comfortable discharging a firearm,  
10 potentially, at that time?

11 A. Absolutely.

12 Q. Last ones, I promise.

13 Any notion -- and I believe you said  
14 no -- to confirm, did you have any notion from  
15 either PSP or Secret Service about who would be in  
16 or around the AGR building?

17 A. No.

18 Q. No knowledge that anyone would be there,  
19 let alone who was there?

20 A. Correct.

21 Q. You confirmed your vehicle didn't have a  
22 camera.

23 Did you have a body camera?

24 A. No.

25 Q. Okay. Anyone else? We talked about a lot

of folks. I don't want to put the other Deputy  
on the list here.

Anyone else you think had a relevant  
vantage point from the sheriff's office on patrol  
or anyone that we should speak to?

A. No. Honestly, Sergeant . Obviously,  
he's here. Myself and the other Deputy , we  
were really the only ones. Everybody else was kind  
of either way far away on the other side or not  
really involved with that part of it.

Q. Got it. And then speaking of the other  
Deputy , in looking at Majority Exhibit 1, he  
was approximately around Point 6; is that right?

A. Yes.

Q. So from that vantage point and your  
knowledge of the event and any other discussions  
you had with him, would he have had a view of the  
shooter from there?

A. No.

Q. And that the trees would have blocked it;  
is that right?

A. Yep. I was just going to say he told me  
the trees were blocking it.

Q. So until shots fired, he didn't have much  
of a vantage point over any of the relevant events?

1 A. Correct.

2 Q. I am done. My colleague may have more. So  
3 thank you.

4 A. Okay.

5 BY [REDACTED]:

6 Q. Thank you again for your time. Just a few  
7 more questions.

8 Just largely to confirm my own  
9 understanding, so I'm going to dart around a bit.  
10 Forgive me for that.

11 We were just asking about body-worn  
12 cameras, and I believe my colleagues from the  
13 Majority asked about whether there was any dash  
14 cam.

15 So no cameras on either person or in the  
16 car?

17 A. Not on me, nope.

18 Q. Is that general for the sheriff's office?

19 A. That's normal.

20 Q. Nobody has any body-worn cameras issued?

21 A. No.

22 Q. You mentioned -- we talked a couple of  
23 times -- about the 2020 Trump rally. I believe you  
24 said you had worked that event and that there was  
25 somebody from Secret Service sort of assigned with

1       you in the car with you that day?

2           A.     Yes.

3           Q.     We've also talked a fair amount about the  
4       communications issues, folks being on different  
5       channels.

6                     Do you recall how that worked back in  
7       2020? Was there one unified channel for folks to  
8       be communicating on, or was it the same sort of  
9       siload different law enforcement?

10          A.     I don't really recall, to be honest with  
11       you. I know there wasn't many of us out there,  
12       meaning like there was the sheriff's office out  
13       there, but there wasn't a lot of like local law  
14       enforcement out there like that.

15                     But communication wasn't really an issue  
16       then.

17          Q.     In what respect? Why was it not an issue?

18                     Are we talking about the channels or the  
19       cellphone towers?

20          A.     I think we were all on the same channel, to  
21       be honest with you. I mean, yeah.

22          Q.     But you're not sure?

23          A.     I'm not 100 percent sure. But I do know I  
24       wasn't scanning then. I can tell you that. I was  
25       not scanning then.



1           Q.    It sounds like it's just your general  
2 practice to scan at events like this if you want to  
3 hear what other law enforcement are doing?

4           A.    Yes, especially because of my everyday --  
5 I'm at the whole southern part of the county, so I  
6 want to hear, you know, what's going on in the  
7 areas that I'm at.

8           Q.    And we've covered this a few different  
9 ways. Sergeant [REDACTED] was in the command post, and  
10 he said anything that needs to be transmitted  
11 elsewhere should go through him first.

12                   I believe you mentioned that he was with  
13 at least somebody from PSP in that command post.  
14 Did you have an understanding of who else was in  
15 this command post with him?

16           A.    I don't. I don't know. I think I may have  
17 asked him after the fact, but honestly, I can't  
18 even remember who else he said was in there with  
19 him.

20           Q.    Fair enough. And it sounds like, but  
21 correct me if I'm wrong, you did have some  
22 awareness there was a separate Secret Service  
23 command post?

24           A.    That's what Sergeant [REDACTED] told me.

25           Q.    So the day of, you were aware of having the

1 two different command posts there?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. Any concerns about that?

4 Did you speak to Sergeant [REDACTED] about  
5 that separation?

6 A. Yeah. I did ask why they weren't together.  
7 He gave me the whole I don't know. But I don't  
8 know anything other than that.

9 Q. Did you have any understanding of whether  
10 there were other law enforcement officials with  
11 Secret Service in their command post?

12 A. I don't know.

13 Q. And any awareness of anybody from Secret  
14 Service being in the sort of local post?

15 A. That's a possibility. I'm not aware of it,  
16 though.

17 Q. Fair enough. I just wanted to confirm.

18 A. Yeah.

19 Q. You also covered a couple times there was  
20 no real meeting or briefing the day of the event,  
21 nothing that you participated in prior to the  
22 rally; correct?

23 A. Correct.

24 Q. Anybody else from the sheriff's office,  
25 that you're aware, having had a briefing with other

1 local law enforcement or the Secret Service?

2 A. No. No deputies. I do know that. I'm not  
3 sure if the chief maybe did. I don't know. But I  
4 do know that no deputies.

5 Q. Okay. So nothing that you've spoken to him  
6 about?

7 A. No.

8 Q. So he might have been part of something?  
9 You're just not sure?

10 A. Yeah, he may have. I'm not sure.

11 Q. We've talked about the photos that  
12 ultimately did not make their way to you or at  
13 least not in a timely fashion.

14 Any understanding of how [REDACTED] got those  
15 photos or who took them, where they came from?

16 A. He said that somebody from the ESU -- I'm  
17 not sure exactly who -- but somebody from the ESU  
18 sent it to him. He told me that.

19 Q. And were they texted to him? E-mailed?

20 A. I don't know for sure. I think they were  
21 texted, but I don't know for sure.

22 Q. Very early on we were talking about the AGR  
23 owner or, I think, who you said you perceived to  
24 be --

25 A. He said he was the owner.

Q. -- he said he was the owner -- having maybe some sort of dispute or altercation with another individual.

Any idea who that person was?

A. He said he was just here for Trump. That's what the other person said.

Q. Got it. But certainly not Mr. Crooks?

A. No, no. Absolutely not, no.

Q. I just wanted to make the record clear on it just being a person in the crowd.

A. Yeah.

Q. I think that was it.

[REDACTED]: Anything else you have?

BY [REDACTED]:

Q. Just very quickly.

Law enforcement relationships: You talked about a limited working relationship with ESU, Butler Township; is that right?

Just to clarify, a limited professional working relationship? When needed, you work together, but that's about it?

A. Yeah.

Q. What about EMS, the Emergency Management folks?

A. We don't really work with them unless we

1 call them and need them.

2 Q. Are you guys -- are there any like -- and,  
3 again, speak only for yourself -- but are there  
4 personal relationships in terms of going to similar  
5 functions or other things where you guys  
6 particularly mesh with one or two of those other  
7 groups, or not really?

8 A. Not really.

9 Q. It seems very clear there was not a unified  
10 command post. My understanding, from what you just  
11 said, is you expressed that concern to [REDACTED] and he  
12 said he didn't know; is that right?

13 A. Correct.

14 Q. But his take was, "Hey, just let me know if  
15 you need anything"?

16 A. Correct.

17 Q. Is that, from your experience, again,  
18 having just done one of these rallies -- but in  
19 your general law enforcement practice and  
20 experience, is this something that is typical that  
21 you would have that silent post, or would you think  
22 it would be more normal for a deputy, who had  
23 concern about the ground level, to have direct  
24 access to PSP, Secret Service, other law  
25 enforcement agencies?

1           A.    I mean, I know there always has to be a  
2   command post, but I just thought everybody would be  
3   able to hear.  It wouldn't have to go through where  
4   I would have to tell somebody, they would have to  
5   tell somebody for it to get to the right person.

6           Q.    At that point, Sergeant [REDACTED], you deferred  
7   to him in the command post because that's how the  
8   structure has been set up?

9           A.    Correct.

10          Q.    All right.  That is all I have.  Good to  
11   go.

12               [REDACTED]:  We are off the record then  
13   at 1544.

14               (Interviewee excused.)

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
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
